With reference to attached correspondence concerning the above named soldiers, I have the honor to report as follows:

According to the men's statements they arrived in New York Saturday afternoon and claim that they were given leave to go ashore but were not told when the train would be leaving with the men. They arrived back at the ship at 10.30 and found that the troops had entrained at 7.30 p.m.. They remained on board the ship all night and reported to the British Consul in the morning. They were handed over to the British Assistant Provost Marshal, New York who arranged their transports to Newfoundland. They were each advanced \$5.00 as subsistence money by the A.P.M. I enclose statement made by the two men to the A.P.M. and also enclose a statement from Capt. Roberts, Commanding Officer of the Draft who states that no permission was given to the men to go ashore. These men are at present on leave for two weeks and the

They arrived in New York on Saturday afternoon and state they were given leave to go ashore but were not told when the train would be leaving New York with the troops. They arrived back at the ship at 10.30 p.m. and found that the troops had entrained at 7.30 p.m.. They remained on board the ship all night and reported to the British Consul in the morning. They were handed over to the British Assistant Provost Marshal, New York who arranged their transports to Newfoundland. They were each advanced Five Dollars, (\$5.00), as subsistence money by the British A.P.M. I enclose statement made by the two men to the A.P.M.
