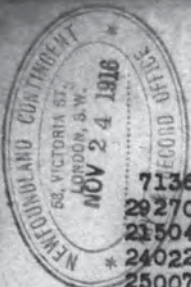

Sir:

I was transferred from my Unit, the Royal Newfoundland Regt., on July 10th 1918, with a view of obtaining a Commission in the R.A.F.

Since the Armistice was signed all instruction in the Camp immediately ceased and men of the Imperial troop in a similar position have been returned to their units. Under these circumstances I have no opportunity of continuing my course and obtaining a Commission.

Seeing that I was within a few weeks of the completion of my course, this is a poor recompense for the trouble I have taken during training.

Men of other Colonial Regiments, irrespective of rank on transfer, are granted rank of acting Sgt. with pay from date of transfer to the R.A.F.

Had I remained with my unit I should no doubt, by now, be receiving a much higher rate of pay than my present one, and I shall be pleased if you will give this your kind consideration.

I am now awaiting orders for return to my unit.

With reference to your letter addressed to 2/Lt. Anderson on the subject of your son's mail, I am sorry to hear that he has not been getting it as regularly as you would wish.

Whatever came to this office from Newfoundland for your son was sent on at once to the 1st Newfoundland Regt., B.E.F. On looking at his record I find he was admitted to the 5th Convalescent Depot at Cayeux on 15/11/16 suffering from muscular rheumatism.

Only in special (seriously ill) cases are letters for men in French hospitals sent to such hospitals by this office. When a man leaves the divisional area (where the battalion is) he is supposed to send his address to the battalion for the redirection of his letters, unless he comes to England, when his mail would be automatically diverted to the home hospital by this office. It is very difficult to keep track of men in French hospitals, nor is it judicious to send mail to them. A soldier is very often only there for a few days, when he is either sent to England (if he is a bad case) or back to his unit (if he is a slight case).

Your son, knowing that he would be in a convalescent Depot for a lengthy time, should have given his address to either:

1. his regiment in France, or
2. this office.

It could hardly be reasonable to expect that he would get his mail unless he asked for it. As he was in a Convalescent depot so long ago as November it was assumed that he had since rejoined the Regiment.

I may add that your son's is an exceptional case.

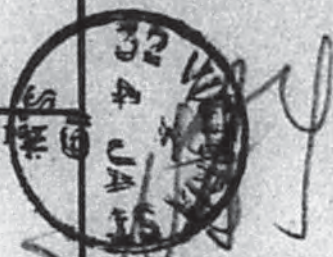

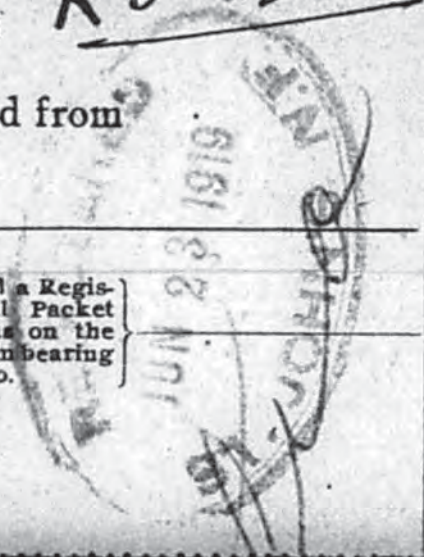

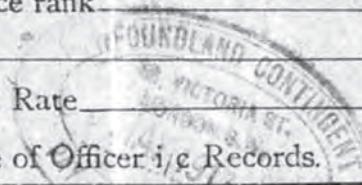

We never lived on Cornwall Avenue. We live on LeMerchant Road West, near the St. Clair's Home, and letters addressed Cornwall Avenue are missent there, or put in Box 5, belonging to Mr. Alfred Martin, who is at Reids, and his son Eric was killed in the July drive. Our boy, Sergeant William H. Martin 2573, who was in the trenches fall of 1916 and wounded at Monchy, April 1917, is now at Winchester, Sergeant of Mess under Sergeant Major *Joe* McKay. The wrong address has led to the mistake of when he was wounded the notification went to Cornwall Avenue and other things same way. I have before notified Mr. Howley on the phone, but the same mistake is continued month after month.
