SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE IN THE CASE OF

#2658. PTE. JAMES MCGORMACK, ROYAL NEWFOUNDLAND REGIMENT.

For the prosecution. #1637. Sergt. Fred Smallwood states; - At the Prince's Rink Barracks, St. John's, on Saturday June 15th, 1918, I was Sergeant of the Guard. About 11AM, on that date the accused was handed over to me by Provost Sergeant to be placed in Detention. About an hour after he asked to go to the Latrine and I detailed #5164 Pte. Smith and #4983 Pte. Chipman as escort. A short while after it was reported to me by #4983 Pte Norman Chipman that accused had broken away and escaped.
F Smallwood Sgt.

For the prosecution #4983. Pte. Norman Chipman states; - At the Prince's Rink Barracks, St. John's, On Saturday June 15th, 1918, I was ordered by the Sergeant of the Guard to go to the Latrine with the accused, coming out of the Latrine door the accused ran for the fence. I caught him by the leg, he kicked me and got over the fence before I could recover myself and I immediately reported the matter to the Sergeant of the Guard.
(1) Questioned by the accused; "Do you remember catching me by the leg?" Ans "I remember catching you by the leg when you were half over the fence."
Norman Chipman

For the prosecution. #5164. Pte. Edward Smith states; - At the Prince's Rink Barracks, St. John's, on Saturday June 15th, 1918, I was ordered by the Sergeant of the Guard to go to the Latrine with Pte. Chipman and the accused. Coming back the latter ran for the fence and I saw Pte. Chipman catching hold of him by the leg. Something happened that made Pte. Chipman fall back.
(1) Questioned by the accused; "Did you see me kick Chipman?" Ans, "No, I did not see you kick him, but something happened that made Chipman fall back."

For the Prosecution. #144 Sergt. John Gardiner states; I was Sergeant of the Guard on the night of June 18th, 1918, at the Prince's Rink Barracks, St. John's. Accused reported himself to the Guard Room at 11.15. PM. he was sober. I received information from Sergt. Whelan that the accused had broken out of Barracks whilst serving detention. I placed him under close arrest.

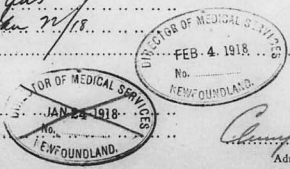

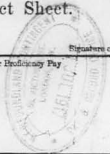

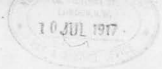
