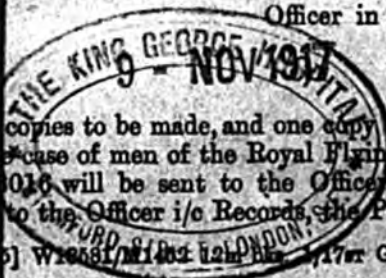

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 7th instant, in respect of your husband, No. 230 Patrick McDonald, late Royal Highland Regiment.

In reply I have to state that this Department has not heard of him since he left the country last June, when we paid to him the amount of your passage to this country, from which he stated he was sending you £10. 
