Sir:-

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of December 9th., regarding the application of Ex-Lieut., Charles McGrath, Corner Brook, for British War and Victory Medals.

I have looked through Mr. McGrath's file and find that a communication was forwarded to Mr. News, the Deputy Secretary of State, on January 15th., 1932, from Major J. M. Howley, Archivist, Militia Records, and for your information I quote hereunder extracts from this communication which fully explains the position regarding Mr. McGrath's claim.

"The Regulations governing the issue of British War Medal and Victory Medal are contained in Army Order No. 266 of 1919. These regulations provide, in the main,

(1) Victory Medal (Allies' Medal). That the claimant will have served in some theatre of war between certain dates.

(2) British War Medal. That the claimant will have left his usual place of residence, and proceeded overseas, for the sole purpose of engaging in active military or naval operations.

Mr. McGrath was studying in Ireland when he enlisted, and the War Office has taken the position that he did not conform to the requirements of the issue of British War Medal, inasmuch as he did not proceed overseas, as they understand it, for the sole purpose of enlisting. They have re-iterated this decision on two or three occasions and I am at a loss to understand how their letter of June 1931 to the British Empire Service League, (No. XV of the enclosure herewith) can be reconciled with their repeated refusal to make the case a special one formerly. The only possible construction I can place on the matter is that the Dominions are empowered, if they so desire, to strike special commemorative medals, as distinct from the regular medals, for those whose services are not otherwise recognised.

I note from the General correspondence on Medals, in my custody, that in 1930 certain proposals were made which contained the proviso that the British War Medal should be issued to every regularly gazetted officer of the forces irrespective of the extent or locus of his services. I am not aware that the proposals were ever

ever put into effect. Rather am I inclined to believe that they were dropped, as, had they been made effective, I, myself, would have become entitled to the British War Medal.

I would respectfully call your attention to the fact that in March 1920 your apartment placed a claim from Mr. McGrath before the Chief Staff Officer, Lt. Col. W.F. Rendell, for report, and he, after consultation with some of the senior officers of the Regiment, reported that he could not recommend the issue. And, I can well understand this position in the light of the repeated ruling of the War Office.

Of course, in the matter of the Victory Medal, Mr. McGrath does not appear to have a claim.

I therefore respectfully report that I can see nothing which makes Mr. McGrath's claim more worthy to-day than it has ever been, and whilst, from the standpoint of Service, the objection raised to the issue is a mere technicality, it is one that can be dealt with only by the War Office, whose authority in this matter, has not, so far as I am aware, been delegated to any Government outside Great Britain.

If, however, you and the Government read the correspondence to mean that the issue will be made if the Government of Newfoundland recommends it, then I see no objection to the recommendation being made, provided that it is made clear that it will not prejudice the position of the War Office with regard to other claimants."

Sir,

I desire to draw to your attention some correspondence in your office relative to the claim of ex Lieut. Charles G. McGrath of Corner Brook for British War and Victory medals. This matter has been the subject of considerable correspondence during the past few years and opinions as to the claimants right to these medals have varied. It appears that the chief objection is that he was unfortunate enough to be in Ireland at school when he enlisted in the Newfoundland Regiment instead of St. John's Newfoundland and therefore did not "proceed overseas for the sole purpose of engaging in active military or naval operations". Strictly this is true, but surely his purpose in enlisting was for "the sole purpose of engaging in active military or naval operations". If this rule is to be carried out to the letter a man who enlisted in the Regiment at Monchy after the Newfoundland Regiment's last fight before the armistice would not be entitled to the medals. That would be an absurd situation.

Furthermore I am credibly informed that at least one member of the Regiment who never left Newfoundland waters has received the medals. I cannot vouch for the accuracy of this however.

Finally I have to draw your attention to a letter from the War Office at Westminster under date June 16, 1931, to the Hon. Secretary of the British Empire Service League, Empire House, Baker Street, London, wherein the War Office distinctly lays it down that "the administration of commemorative War Medals for the Great War, in the case of Dominion Troops, is vested in the respective Dominion Governments, consequently, the eligibility of Lieutenant C.G. McGrath, late Royal Newfoundland Regiment, is solely a question for the Newfoundland authorities".

This seems conclusive, and it is for your Government to say whether or not Lieut. McGrath is to be penalised because he was in Ireland when he enlisted, instead of St. John's Newfoundland or some part of New Zealand. I feel sure that you will give this matter your sympathetic consideration, and see that Lieut. McGrath gets justice.



With reference to your letter of the 17th July last on the subject of the claim of 2nd Lieut. C. McGrath of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment to the British War Medal, I am directed by His Excellency the Administrator to inform you that he is now in receipt of a despatch from the Secretary of State to the effect that as Mr. McGrath did not leave Newfoundland with the express intention of enlisting into His Majesty's Forces on reaching England, he cannot be considered to be eligible for the award of the medal in question. Dear Leo:-

I am in receipt of your letter of 15th. inst., enclosing official communication to Dr. Paterson, as President of the Great War Veterans' Association, from the branch at Corner Brook, having reference to non-receipt of medals by Lt. Charles G. McGrath. This letter I am returning herewith.

The position as I understand it from correspondence here, is that Mr. McGrath did not leave his home for the express purpose of engaging in military operations, and as a consequence the War Office does not consider him to be entitled to either the General Service or the Victory Medals.

I might say that on March 30th. 1920 the Chief Staff Officer asked for the War Office ruling on Mr. McGrath's claim, and again on July 19th. 1920. In this latter letter he stressed the position of Mr. McGrath, with a view to having a special case made, but the decision of the War Office was as above quoted.

In 1922 the matter was taken up with the Secretary of State for the Dominions by the Governor of the day, and he communicated the result (which was the same decision), to the Great War Veterans' Association, on Sept. 25th. 1922.

In August 1929, in answer to an enquiry from Mr. McGrath, I cited this

decision to him, and have heard nothing more of the matter until I received this communication from you.

I take it that this information is required by the Great War Veterans' Association, although you do not sign your letter in any official capacity, and the communication did not reach me through official channels.

I trust that this information will be sufficient for your requirements. Should you care to see the actual correspondence in this matter I shall be glad to show it to you, if you can make it convenient to call at my office.

Re Comrade Charles G. McGrath.

On the 4th December, 1930, I took up the matter of the issuance of General Service or Victory Medals to the above-named ex-service man. I understand that you have been made aware of the facts of the case through my official letter to Dr. Paterson, which was presented to you by Leo C. Murphy on the 15th April, 1931. Your reply to Mr. Murphy's letter intimated that the War Office does not consider McGrath to be entitled to either of the Medals.

Through the Great War Veterans' Association of Newfoundland Comrade McGrath's case was laid before the British Empire Service League, who in turn referred it to the War Office. I am enclosing herewith a copy of the War Office letter of 16th June, 1931, and from it you learn that the matter in question rests solely with the Newfoundland Government. Copies of these letters and other correspondence were submitted to the Secretary of State, who referred the matter to the Board of Pension Commissioners; and now I learn that the whole matter has been referred to you for consideration and recommendation. I feel sure that after perusing the correspondence that has been submitted to you the necessary recommendation in McGrath's favour will be granted. Please let me know at an early date your action thereon.

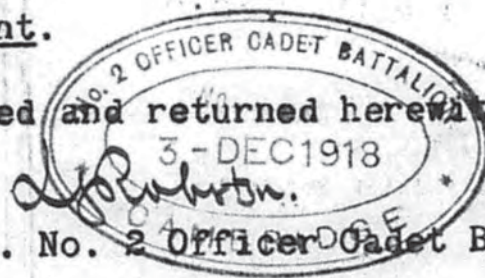
