

Veteran Killed At Sea.

Killed June 26/1921

On Saturday, Mrs. John Thomey, received the sad news that her grandson, Ex-Lieut. Thomas Bernard McGrath, 3rd Engineer of the Elder Steel S.S. Co's. steamship "Deerfield" had been killed on June 26th, by falling into the ship's hold, whilst on a voyage from Manchester to Rio de Janeiro. The ship was in mid-ocean at the time of the accident, and the particulars, as given by the Captain, are very vague the only information to hand being that of the 2nd engineer, who was sitting on the deck near No. 4 hatch, on the evening of the accident, when he heard a noise as of somebody falling, and on proceeding to investigate found the badly fractured body of the young engineer laying at the bottom of the ship. He was bleeding from the nose, mouth and left ear, the skull had been fractured and other parts of the body were also badly bruised, death being almost instantaneous. The body was tenderly lifted from the hold and prepared for burial, which took place the next morning, when the Deerfield was stopped, and amidst the solemn and impressive service, the body of the Newfoundland Veteran was consigned to the deep. The late Thomas McGrath was well known in the city, where his sudden and tragic passing will be keenly felt by his many friends. Educated at St. Bonaventure's College, he later served his apprenticeship at the Reid Nfld. Co's machine shop, leaving there when the Call came in 1914, and joining the First Contingent, going to England on the S.S. Florizel. He saw considerable service with the Regiment, both at Gallipoli and France, and was invalided home, being wounded in the shoulder. On recovery from his wounds, he was transferred to the Forestry Corps, and was given a Commission. After being demobilized he proceeded to New York, from which port he has been sailing during the past two years. Six months ago he visited the old home on a week's vacation, when all his old friends were very pleased to hear of his success. Deceased is the last of his immediate family living, his parents having predeceased him some years ago, whilst a younger brother was killed in action in August 1918. His nearest relatives are his grandmother, Mrs. John Thomey, his uncle, Mr. S.J. Murphy of this city, and Mrs. Edward Moriarity, Harbour Grace and Mrs. Frank Maher, Carbonear, both aunts, to whom the News extends sincere sympathy.

With this knowledge of him and a favourable recollection of him, I learnt casually in conversation with Major Carty that the lad was still a candidate for a Commission, so I brought up his name again. Major Carty mentioned to me that he had received a letter about him from Capt. Fox as would be quite natural and not improper and that two Captains of the Regiment were also interested in the promotion.

I saw no letters on the subject: and I do not think that either Capt. Fox in writing a private letter to Major Carty about the men they know and take an interest in, nor Major Carty for mentioning the lad's name to me was guilty of an indiscretion or a breach of discipline.

I still think that young McGrath has the makings of a good officer.

I shall, if Mr. R.G. Rendell wishes it, send the correspondence to Lieut. Col. Whitaker. But I think Colonel Whitaker would be obliged if the names of aspirants were made known to him. Those who want to rise should be kept under observation.

Dear Sir:-

At yesterday's meeting of Standing Committee an application for Commission came before us from one Private McGrath, a returned disabled soldier. This was backed up by a letter from Capt. Fox to Major Carty.

I intended making special reference to this, but overlooked it. In my opinion such action by Captain Fox is most indiscreet, and I cannot help thinking if it came to the knowledge of his Commanding officer he would be severely reprimanded.

As you are aware, we have much trouble and worry over such applications, and if all such junior officers are allowed to act in this way, and no doubt behind their C.O.'s back, it must have a bad effect on discipline.

I suggest that you show this letter to "His Excellency" and if he agrees he will no doubt take steps to prevent its recurrence. If not, I think it will be advisable to have the matter discussed at our next meeting.
