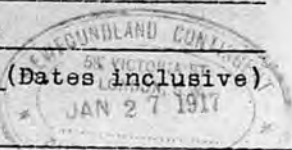

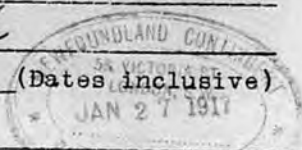

This man was attested on September 9th 1914, embarked for overseas October 3rd 1915, proceeded to Egypt and Gallipoli and served there until October 29th 1915 when he was invalided with Dysentery and Frostbite. He returned to England on January 3rd 1916 and was repatriated to Newfoundland on February 10th 1917. On return to this country he was granted three months sick furlough, and was then returned to duty in connection with the Home Defence Scheme. On February 15th 1918 he was admitted to the Military Infectious Disease Hospital suffering from Venereal Disease, and was discharged from Hospital on March 23rd 1918. He was discharged from the Forces as unfit for further Military Service on April 5th 1919. He has had one conviction for drunk and four convictions for minor offences. On discharge Medical Board states that his capacity for earning a livelihood in the labour market is lessened 10%. On his discharge from the Forces he applied for a general education course which was refused on the ground that he was able to undertake his former occupation. Employment was obtained for him at Harvey's Bakery but he gave it up stating that the work was too hard. He was medically boarded and sent to Escasoni Hospital on April 21st for observations for lung trouble, and was discharged from Hospital with an ill disability. ~~On~~ May 13th he was granted.

granted full disability pension whilst at Excasoni. He applied to the Civil Re-Establishment Committee for employment and a position was secured for him in the Nail Factory at \$12.00 per week. He left this of his own volition. Employment was then found for him in the Trade Bakery at \$15.00 per week. Shortly afterwards he left this place and again applied for a school course. On October 15th he reported sick to the Empire Barracks Hospital and was admitted to the Hospital on October 22nd and discharged on November 6th 1919. He was again boarded on November 11th when he was reported to be wearing a special boot to relieve his foot (frostbite) and was recommended for 20% disability pension with continued treatment. On January 24th 1920 he was again boarded and recommended for continuance of the 20% disability pension. This man applied to the Civil Re-Establishment Committee on March 19th for a course in general education. His Medical report states general condition for physical examination negative, legs and feet which were frostbitten in Gallipoli in fair condition. Medical opinion that he able to resume work. The opinion of the Civil Re-Establishment Committee was that he should resume his former occupation and that he should attend night school to improve his education. His case was before the Committee again on October 3rd 1919 when it was suggested that he should interview the Vocational Officer for recommendation as to his future. His case was again presented to the Civil Re-Establishment Committee on October 10th when he was referred for treatment at the Military and Naval Convalescent Home. Again on November 7th

his case was considered and it was decided that whilst he was undergoing treatment at Hospital he should have the advantages of the school, but he would not come under the Civil Re-Establishment Committee's maintenance scheme. While this man was living at home and having outpatient treatment at the Hospital he was paid \$7.20 per week towards living expenses while unable to carry on his work. Part of this man's disability which he claims was Rheumatism has been stated by a Medical Officer to be Arthritis right knee. On December 18th employment was secured for him as cook on the train. This was relinquished for the reason that, according to his statement, he was unable to read the meal orders. A letter was sent on January 7th to the Superintendent of the A.N.D. Co., Grand Falls in a further endeavour to get work for him and this letter was followed by two telegrams but without meeting with success. On January 14th his case was represented to the Patriotic Fund Committee and that Committee agreed to make him an allowance of \$5.00 a week while he was out of work. His pension at this time was \$10.00 per month. About the end of February he decided to go to Halifax to obtain employment and was given a letter of recommendation to Lt.Col.Montgomerie, Manager of the Furness Withy Co., at Halifax. He applied to the Civil Re-Establishment Committee, the Patriotic Fund Committee, the Pensions Board and the Department of Militia for his passage to Halifax. None of these felt justified in paying his passage, incidentally he pleaded lack of cash for this purpose. It is known that he was able to play poker

It can be seen that no effort has been spared by the Civil Re-Establishment Committee and others who came in touch with this man to do everything within their power to assist him.


