With reference to the enclosed application for Separation Allowance in favour of this Soldier's children: Memorandum from his Commanding Officer is quoted for information,-

"Reference attached N. F. P/32 for 3244, Corp. E. Monahan.
"This N. C. O. applied to have form filled out and on question him the following facts were elicited. He was married and had 5 children previous to leaving Newfoundland. His wife died on August 12th. 1917. Of his 5 children one is at Mount Cashel Orphanage, and two at Belvedere Orphanage. The two youngest are living with his sister in law, Mrs. P. Kennedy. As I read the Regulations (Sect. 5, Para. 2B) nothing will be allowed for children who are in a Benevolent Institution. I presume this does not debar him from receiving the allowance for the two children who are not in an institution. He has also some grievance concerning the matter of his allotment. After the death of his wife he received a letter from the Patriotic Association informing him they had arranged for her burial. He also heard that a distribution of his allotment was made, giving a proportion for the three children in Orphanages and the balance for the two living with his sister in law. He is uncertain about this and would like to

The payments in this case are as follows: Allotment 80¢ per day or approximately \$24.00 per month and Separation Allowance \$20. per month both of which payments are paid to the Patriotic Fund which makes the following arrangements. Mrs Kennedy \$5. per week, Mount Cashel \$2. per week, Belvedere \$3. per week, there will eventually be a difference to adjust one way or the other. A reduction of the allotment to 60¢ per day would naturally upset the present arrangements and require a new adjustment and if any reduction of allotment is carried into effect you will of course notify this department by telegraphing.



I have the honour to lay before you for your consideration the following facts, and to ask for a ruling as to what is best to be done in the matter.

The above mentioned soldier was married previous to his enlistment, and has five children, his wife died on 12th August 1917, and he, himself, was "Killed in Action" on 20th October 1918. Separation Allowance was granted to the "Guardians" of the children from September 1, 1917, until a PENSION was awarded to them.

A claim has now been received for Retrospective Separation Allowance payable from the date of Sgt. Menahan's enlistment to the 31st August 1917; and while there is no question, whatever, of making payments, we should like to be instructed as to when it should be made.

The position is this, that the "Guardians" of the children at the present time, did not have the care of the children at the period which the claim covers, and consequently we do not feel like making payments to them, as the money, undoubtedly, belongs to the children themselves.
