Dear Mr. Bennett,

I find that the increasing press of my business affairs demands my full time, and that in consequence thereof I shall be unable to devote the same time as heretofore to military work. I am desirous of relinquishing my appointment as District Officer Commanding as early as possible. The work of this department will now centre largely around demobilisation and a Discharge Depot has been established with capable officers who are able to look after the detail work. Major G.T. 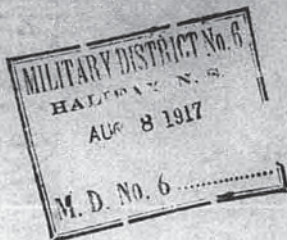

I desire to place on record my complete

satisfaction with the arrangements which have been

completed for the accommodation of the troops now

undergoing training in Ft. John's under your

command.

At my inspection of the Barracks yesterday I was

greatly impressed with the skill with which you have

utilised the accommodation at the Rinks and in the

adjacent premises.

This sleeping accommodation is excellent for

summer time. I trust that before the winter comes on

the numbers under your command will have been largely

reduced and that we may avoid the difficulty in warming

the large building by the transfer of the sleeping

accommodation to the Curling Rink.

I was pleased to see how successfully you

had grappled with the problems connected with the

lighting of the premises, the ingenious methods for

providing a subdued light after "Lights Out" and the

system of control. The provision against fire is also

excellent. The sanitary service and the lavatory

arrangements seem to me as good as possible.

The plans for messing of all ranks is very good

and the cooking arrangements appear satisfactory. I

understand that all ranks in every mess are rationed on

the same food and that there are no complaints as

as regards either quantity or quality. The provision of a space in the same building as a recreation room is satisfactory.

The guard room and cells appear to me sufficient and I note that the Orderly Room charges are few in number and that the offenders brought up represent a very small proportion of the whole force. The offences do not appear to me to be of a serious character nor to reflect on the good character which the men have already earned for themselves in the City. I think it is a good idea of yours to employ the defaulters on levelling the exercise ground thus making them useful.

I trust that the establishment of the Soldiers' and Sailors' Club will be a boon to the N.C.O's and men during their leisure hours.

I inspected the Quartermaster's Department and the Store Rooms which show that Lieut. H. Outerbridge is rendering exceptionally good service in barracks as he had previously done before he volunteered for active service abroad.

You have shown much ingenuity in adapting the premises at the Skating Rink for administration purposes especially in relation to the Orderly Room and to the requirements of a ward for observation cases reported to the Senior Medical Officer. In this connection I desire you to express to Major L. 

Dear Capt. Montgomerie,

I am much obliged to you for the letters dated Nov. 22nd which reached me on the 10th inst.

I reply very briefly:

(1) The Male Prisoners of War have been retained in Canada but are transferred from Beauport to Amherst. The women are still here under the supervision of the Ministry of Justice.

(2) Of the Hospital Orderlies (5), one - Churchill - has been returned as medically unfit.

(3) I am as O.C. very pleased that Major Whitaker has retained your services until January 10th. Personally, I hope that the prolonged absence will not prejudice your status with the Furness Withy Company.

(4) It is very satisfactory to us to note that so many Officers, N.C.O.'s and Men are receiving special training, through the initiation of Major Whitaker whose reports are much appreciated here.

(5) Your reports - framed by you with the concurrence of Major Whitaker for information of the Reserve Force Committee - have been passed on to the Committee as regards the welfare of the Regiment, Religious privileges and the methods of selection and promotion.

A good deal of criticism has arisen here on the information of soldiers in private letters (published in the Press here) alledging cold through

non-supply of underclothing. This new opportunity for criticism has been exploited freely and may do permanent harm to the W.P.A. and to recruiting; but its lack of good foundation has now been established. If I had been kept informed by the Newfoundland Association in London, or by Capt. Timewell, of the despatch of comforts to the Regiment, or if the O.C. at the Dardanelles would communicate with me on this and kindred subjects, the criticisms might have been forestalled.

Mr. Geo.W.D. Ayre has presented £500 for the Newfoundland soldier who wins the highest award for Valour.






