- (5) Your reports framed by ou with the concurrence of Major Whitaker for information of the Reserve Torce Committee- have been passed on to the Committee as regards the welfare of the Regiment, Religious privileges and the methods of selection and promotion.

A good deal of criticism has arisen here on the information of soldiers in private letters (published in the Press here) alledging cold through non-supply of underclothing. This new opportunity for criticism has been exploited freely and may do permanent harm to the W.P.A. and to recruiting: but its lack of good foundation has now been established. If I had been kept informed by the Newfoundland Association in London, or by Capt. Timewell, of the despatch of comforts to the Regiment, or if the O.C. at the Dardanelles would communicate with me on this and kindred subjects, the criticisms might have been forestalled.

Mr. Geo.W.B. Ayre has presented \$500 for the Newfoundland soldier who wins the highest award for Valour.






