

Sir:-

With reference to your letter addressed to the Pay & Record Office concerning the estate of the above mentioned soldier, I have the honour to inform you that the final account is now in the hands of the Minister of Justice and will be dispersed as soon as letters of administration are received. Since writing your letter you have received certain effects and your receipt is in this office.

You have been evidently mis-informed with respect to the matter of soldiers relatives receiving full pay until the end of the war in case where the soldier has been killed. It is true that in certain cases dependents of deceased soldiers are entitled to pensions but a matter of pensions is one that is dealt with by the Pension & Disabilities Board. It is understood that Separation Allowance at the rate of 70¢ per day as formerly is still being paid to you and will be continued until such time when the matter of pensions has been decided.

With reference to the following letter from William Moor, father of the above deceased Soldier, 8/10/17 (6495),-

"I am anxious to learn if my son  
"No. 2189, Sgt. James E. Moor, who  
"died in France on the 8th. Feb.  
"this year, has any money due him  
"at the pay office at the time  
"of his death. He was a frugal  
"saving boy, and though he may  
"have drawn all his pay while  
"in England, where there were more  
"opportunities for spending, I  
"feel sure that for the three  
"months or more that he was in France  
"he must have drawn very little.  
" . . . I would also be very glad  
"if you could locate any little  
"belongings of his such as wrist  
"watch, fountain pen, pay book and  
"clothes, as so far, I have only  
"received a little bag containing  
"identification disc, a couple of  
"pencils, pocket books, and  
"articles of devotion.  
" . . . I am informed that one who  
"sings for duration of the war  
"and loses his life in action,  
"is entitled to full pay until  
"the end of the war. My son was  
"signed under these conditions  
"for duration of war) and if there  
"is anything due on that account  
"as well as on account of pay not  
"drawn I would be very glad if  
"you would look it up and see that  
"it is forwarded to me. My son was  
"my only support and now with  
"failing health and increasing  
"difficulties of living I need  
"not tell you that anything due  
"me on my son's account will be  
"more than welcome to me."
