

Dear Mr. Bennett,

The father of #2778 Pte. John F. Moore of C. Company, Nfld. Regiment, came to see me yesterday and brought with him letters he had received from his son, who is a Prisoner of War at Kriegsgefangenen, Stammlager, Lemberg ad Lahn, Fruher Wahn. Pte. Moore writes asking his father to send him parcels weekly containing food. I explained to the father that parcels were not allowed to be sent to Prisoners of War in Germany, but that there was a Society in England, which was undertaking to send out parcels to prisoners belonging to Newfoundland. His father says from the letters received he gathers that his son is receiving no parcels. I shall be glad, therefore, if you will communicate with the Society and bring this case before them.







Dear Mr. Moore,

On the first of December you visited the then Acting Prime Minister concerning your son, #2778 Pte. John F. Moore. The matter was referred to this department and a communication sent to the Record Office, London, to have the matter of non-delivery of parcels enquired into. The Newfoundland War Contingent Association now report, under date 10th December that while #2778 J.F. Moore was at Limburg, no acknowledgements of parcels were received from him. Since then however acknowledgements have been received dated 17th and 23rd October. This goes to show that the food parcels had then begun to reach him, and it is hoped that the supply has been continuous and regular since. They are being sent forward by the N.W.C.A. to the maximum amount allowed.







Company in France "O" Company

Place and date of Capture - Mohchy-le-Preux - April 14th, 1917

Circumstances of Capture - We got to our objective and dug in; there were seven of us together consolidating a shell hole. We were surrounded in the big counterattack, and were taken prisoners.

Details of life and treatment - We were marched back to Douai where we stayed for 5 days, and then were sent to Fort MacDonald in Lille for 5 days. The treatment was the same as that detailed by the other ~~prisoners~~ prisoners in this camp. I then went to Guesnain for 6 weeks, building railways behind the German lines. We were sleeping in cellars there, and had no blankets or greatcoats and it was bitterly cold at night time. The food was bad, and we had only a part of a small loaf for the day. We had to work from 6.30 a.m. till 5 p.m. We only had one interval during the day of ½ hour at noon. The German sentries carried sticks and did not hesitate to use them whenever they felt like it, and they drove us at work.

- We were then shifted to Marcheinesville to work in a forest. , for about a month. We had much better treatment here. I went sick here as the result of the hard work at Guesnain, and could hardly keep going I was so weak. I was sent to Hospital for 5 weeks. Then I was sent into Germany to Langensals from August 1917 to December 1918 when I was repatriated. I was on farm work at this place, and things were a little better and we had more liberty, The camp was very cold and we were not allowed any fires although it was winter time. I got Red Cross parcels and my mail from home fairly regularly after they started coming. I arrived back in England on Dec. 22nd via Rotterdam.

With reference to above quoted No., the following letter has been received from Mr. C.R. Moore, 176 Hamilton Avenue, St. John's, and replied to as per copy of this office No. 346/1 attached, please:

"I beg to notify you that I have received word from my brother Pte. John F. Moore, 2778, C. Company, 1st Newfoundland Regiment, that he is Prisoner of War in Germany, and has been so since April 14th/17, and from that date to Sept. 16/17, when he wrote his letter, he claims that he has not received a parcel from Prisoners of War Association, or whatever Association that looks out for Prisoners of War Comforts.

Now, this is too bad to have a chap that fought for his Country until taken Prisoner and then when Prisoner let starve through neglect.

I might also add that on his letter he mentioned that he had been ill for six weeks through hunger and that only when unable to stand longer was he put in Hospital.

He also mentions of another chap, a friend of his, Private John Woods, and says they are the only two Prisoners where they are stationed, both having been captured together.

Now Major, I have taken up this matter personally and hope you will give this your best possible and immediate attention, and see that both my brother,
