Dear Sir Robert,

In reply to your letter of the 22nd inst., asking that Pte. Morgan be discharged immediately on arrival, I may say I fear such will be hardly possible. What we propose to do in disposing of the Men is to send those home whose homes are within easy access by rail as soon as possible after arrival. Pte. Morgan will, therefore, be included in this class, but he will have to return to St. John's at a later date for Medical Board and final discharge. He will be notified of such date before leaving here. This will necessitate his coming to St. John's again for two or three days later in the month. If, however, it is at all possible to make an exception in this case so that his immediate discharge will be consummated, I shall endeavour to do so.

STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

#2867, Pte. George Morgan, Whitbourne.

Enlisted June 1916. Proceeded Overseas - August 1916

Company in France - "B" Company

Place & Date of Capture - Monchy-le-Preux, April 14th, 1917

Circumstances of Capture - During the attack I was the only L.G. left in my section and my Lewis Gun was knocked out of action by a piece of shell. When the Germans broke through on our left they came up behind us and we were completely surrounded and taken prisoners.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - After a few days at ~~Fort~~ Douai, Fort McDonald, Lille, I was sent to Guesnain for about three months working on the Railroads. We had a very hard time of it here, and lived in an unfinished brick building. It had no doors or windows, or floors and we had to lie on the bare ground, which consisted of small stones and sand, and we were without blankets or greatcoats, and some nights it was so cold that we could not sleep but had to get up and walk around the room in the dark. The food was awful. For three weeks our food consisted of two meals - at 6 a.m. a small loaf of black bread for 5 men and in the evening a steel-helmet full of turnips and water for 14 men. We had to work from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily, and the only interval we had was half an hour at noon. They drove us to work and at the least sign of slacking up they used to use a stick on us or the butts of their rifles. After about three weeks we got a little more soup, or at least a little more water. We were then shifted to Marchiennes from June to November where we worked in the woods and lumber yards. Our treatment was a little better here as we were given a wooden bed and a blanket each, but the food was just the same. Our next move was to Germany, and we arrived at Friedericksville. After three weeks I was sent to Parchim for three days and then to Wesbek for 4 days and finally to Enfield, where I stayed till the Armistice was signed. I had to work in the factories there. For the first time since I was taken prisoner I began to get three meals a day and then when the Red Cross Parcels arrived conditions were not so bad. I found that a lot of the parcels were tampered with and the food stolen before they reached us. On our party there were 36 Russians, and they were to a man bitter against England, and they were always making trouble for us in the Camp. They were very friendly with the Germans and were always telling tales on us and trying to harm us in every way. I was repatriated via Denmark and arrived in Hull on January 11th.
