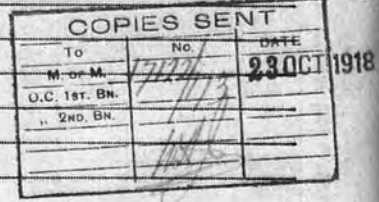

Opinion of the Medical Board.

Notes.—(i.)
