Circumstances of Capture - Wounded in left hand and right arm, was surrounded by the enemy.

Time while under Capture - I was taken first to Douai Hospital and had no treatment whatever from any doctor. My diet during that time consisted of boiled potatoes only. On the morning of April 19th we were taken on board trains and taken to a place called Duisburg in Germany. The journey took us three days and once during that time I got one small portion of soup. Arrived at Duisburg on the 21st April and received medical attention that being the first since I was taken prisoner. My wounds were then dressed every four days paper bandages being used, which was of no use, so I had to use my puttees for bandages instead. Food was not what it should have been, our breakfast consisted of one slice of black bread without butter and one cup of coffee with no milk or sugar. Dinner consisted of one kind of soup, which only starvation would prompt me to drink. Tea was the same as Breakfast.

On June 20th I was taken from Hospital and placed in a prison camp in Dulmen. There the food was worst than in Hospital we remained there for six months, there were about fifteen hundred prisoners and would not allow them to go clear of the Camp.

On Aug. 23rd I was sent to Soltan which proved to be the best Camp I was in in Germany, the food and treatment there being very good, but my stay there was very short, for early in September (forgetting the date) I was taken to a place called Bohnte, which they renamed (for reason best known to themselves) Hameln 17. I learnt afterwards that it was the place where the H.C.O.'s were to go, who refused to work, and there were nine hundred prisoners there. We arrived there late at night, the rain was pouring in torrents and we were very wet, all our belongings were then taken from us and put inside the hut, and we were driven inside like a flock of sheep,

With not a drop of water to drink, several of us were hit with the bullets of the machine rifles for not going farther, which owing to our condition we were unable to do. There were about six hundred of us shoved into one hut and there was not room enough to turn around that night, and the next morning the door was opened and a bucket of water poured into us. A hour or so we were told to fall in outside the hut to be searched, only the clothes we had on were left in our possession. After the search we were asked to go to work, which we refused to do. Unluckily of the worst kind was then at once visited upon us, we were not allowed any exercise which we were receiving from the red cross, it is stated in attention six hours a day in all weathers. We were not permitted to have any lights after 5 p.m. (the first twenty one days were not allowed any lights at all) We were also prevented from reading any letters. Our food during that time consisted of one slice of bread per day and boiled carrots three times. Seeing we would not volunteer to work after 12 days we were compelled to do so, we had to dig up ground, plant potatoes, and weed for the crop, cutting hay and soot. We would start at 6 a.m. finish at 9 p.m. We would then be taken back to camp and locked up for the night. After I spent fourteen days in there for trying to make my escape, with soup and bread only every four days. In 1916 the prisoners of 1914, which were in the same camp were sent to Holland, and there they reported our condition and a representative of the Holland Ambassador was sent to visit the camp, after that things went a little better, but we were made to understand that we were not to be allowed to work.

on the 21st of April & rec^d medical treatment being the first since I was taken prisoner.

My wounds were then dressed every four days paper bandages being used, which were of no use, so I had to use my puttees for bandages instead.

Food was not what it should have been, our breakfast consisted of one slice of black bread without butter & one cup of coffee with no milk or sugar.

Dinner consisted of some kind of soup, which only starvation would prompt me to drink.

Tea was the same as Breakfast.

On June 20th I was taken from Hospital & placed in a prison camp in Dulmen. There the food was worse than in Hospital we remained there for two months, there were about fifteen hundred prisoners in the one camp. German Sentries were very hard to prisoners & would not allow them to go clear of the camp.



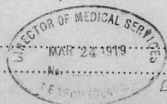
