Dear Mr. Squires,

I would like to bring to your notice the case of Mr. formerly Pte.No.488 T. Mouland of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment who is going to Newfoundland to visit his relatives.

Mr.Mouland has had the great misfortune to be blinded in the war and, in addition, his general health is very indifferent.

Passage/for himself and his wife to Newfoundland are being arranged at Government expense by the "Sachem" May 4th sailing; as he is entitled to repatriation.

Mr.Mouland, however, has been advised that he is not in a condition of health that will permit him to reside in Newfoundland, as the climate is rather too severe at times, and he is worried about return passages for himself and his wife at about the end of September.

I am sure it will be your wish to help Mr.Mouland and therefore I am asking that instructions may be given to the Militia Department that Mr.Mouland and his wife be granted free passages back to England.

" recently, as of course, the idea

" again is most distressing to him.

It is suggested that Newland and his wife should come over to Newfoundland in the spring, but whilst he is entitled to a repatriation passage in addition to being a Blue Puttee man, strictly speaking his wife is not, but being one of those cases which had to be discharged before admission to Grosvenor Sanatorium, he could not be married as a soldier.

Generally, it would seem a case for special consideration and action, and if his wife is granted a passage, the question of return of both to this Country will arise as he cannot live in Newfoundland.

Will you please furnish necessary instructions to form full reply to the inquoted letter.

The above named ex-soldier who is totally blind as a result of a shell wound in left eye received in January, 1916, is desirous of returning to this country with his wife for a short time in order to visit his parents. He is at present residing in England, and would be unable to live here permanently as the climate of this country would not agree with his condition.

I am attaching herewith copy of a letter received by our London Office from the Secretary Blind Sailors and Soldiers Hostel, St. Dunstan's, dated 29/11/19, which strongly recommends Moulard's and his wife's passage to and from this country. Passage to this country for him and his wife is authorised under present existing regulations, and I should be glad to know if his return passage may be authorised.



"With reference to your telegram of 5th Feb. 488 Moulard, Pension Board decide he is entitled to \$40.00 per month, with additional amount of \$20.00 per month payable to institution on account of upkeep, or payable to helper if necessary".

in reply to your cable of 5th Feb. as follows:-

"Reference to my letter of Sep. 11th, No. 15, and in answer to your telegram of Jan. 30th, 488 Moulard, suggest reference to parallel case 1122 Lench grant of Government pension of \$40.00 per month, in addition to sanitarium treatment payable from Nfld. Government. See also paragraph No. 2, Pensions and Disabilities Board, letter, Dec. 5th under heading 1140 Snelgrove. Should not maintenance Moulard in sanitarium be at expense of Nfld. Government.

I attach herewith copy of letter from Secretary of Pensions and Disabilities Board outlining their decision in the case of Pte. Moulard.

Moulard's account has been adjusted in accordance with your instructions and statement of his account to date is being furnished for the information of the Pensions Commissioners under separate cover. The following notes made by Major Parsons whilst attached here are quoted,-

BLIND. Admitted to St-Dunstan's DISCHARGED on admission to Grosvenor Sanatorium on 15/6/17.
PENSION. \$40.00 per month and \$20.00 for maintenance. Remained at Sanatorium 152 days @ 5/6d. per day. Imperial Govt. paid for 28 days remainder deducted from \$60.00 per month, which would allow Moulard net Pension \$3. per month. Discharged from Sanatorium to St. Dunstan's 11/12/17. Compare with case of Costello, 1157. CANADIAN REGULATIONS, is that man receives Hospital treatment free in T.B. cases up to 6 months, before disc. blind, an allowance of \$175. for attendant for 1st. 6 weeks and \$150. afterwards. Is this man sufficiently advanced to return to Newfoundland.



It is understood that Mouland is to be paid \$60.00
per month, less the cost of treatment in Grosvenor Sanatorium,
namely 5/6 per day, and payments have been made and adjusted
as shewn in the enclosed statement.

Copies of correspondence exchanged with the Local
Government Board anent treatment of tuberclose Soldiers is
also enclosed for information. It will be observed that the
Imperial Government undertakes to pay the cost of maintenance
for 28 days from the date of admission. In connection with
this arrangement it is understood that for this period,
Mouland will be entitled to Pension at the rate of \$40.00 per
month, but will not receive the \$20.00 per month in respect
of allowance towards cost of maintenance, which for this
period (28 days) is borne ex. Imperial Funds. Confirmation, or
otherwise of this ruling is requested in order that procedure
in similar cases may be made clear.

The above ruling is not in accordance with Canadian
custom, in so far as it effects the adjustment of cost of
treatment in such cases, also the procedure in dealing with a
tuberculous Soldier is somewhat different in that he continues
to be a member of the Canadian Forces and receives pay and
allowances at regular rates until such time as he no longer
requires treatment and is discharged from the Force, and is
granted a pension.

Replying to yours of July 21st, which only reached me yesterday, respecting No. 488 Private T. Moulard, I would say that this man, under Canadian pension ratings which we are following, would be entitled to a pension of \$40 a month, as his disability from blindness, not to speak of tuberculosis, would be total, and his condition of blindness would also entitle him to an extra allowance for a helper up to \$250 a year. Our Board accordingly suggests that His Excellency be moved to wire Major Timewell to pay Private Moulard pension at the rate of \$40 a month for himself, and to make an allowance of \$20 per month towards his maintenance in any Institution in which he is being cared for; subject, of course, to the right of any permanent Pension Board appointed later to vary this regulation.



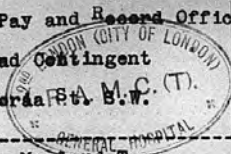

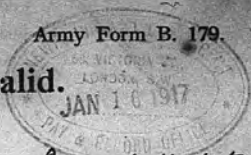

Replying to yours of July 21st, which only reached me yesterday, respecting No.488 Private T. Moulard, I would say that this man, under Canadian pension ratings which we are following, would be entitled to a pension of \$40. a month, as his disability from blindness, not to speak of tuberculosis, would be total, and his condition of blindness would also entitle him to an extra allowance for a help^u up to \$250 a year. Our Board accordingly suggests that His Excellency be moved to wire Major Timewell to pay Private Moulard pension at the rate of \$40. a month for himself, and to make an allowance of \$20. per month towards his maintenance in any Institution in which he is being cared for; subject, of course, to the right of any permanent Pension Board appointed later to vary this regulation.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of the 12th. instant, under file "9374/1/FM/WF" asking for a ruling as to pension of the marginally named soldier, who has been admitted to a Sanatorium suffering from tuberculosis and total blindness.

In reply I beg to advise that a soldier suffering from tuberculosis is usually given six months free Sanatorium treatment before being discharged from service.

After discharge, if he has not had this treatment, and is recommended for same by a Board of Medical Officers, arrangements are made that this treatment be given free of charge and a total pension paid during the period of such treatment.

This Board does not recommend an extra allowance for an attendant while a soldier is receiving free Sanatorium or hospital treatment, but on discharge from hospital or Sanatorium, if he is confined to bed and incapable of attending to his own personal wants, a recommendation is made for an allowance for attendant up to £250.

In totally blind cases alone, on discharge, the

man automatically receives allowance for attendant,
\$175. ^{per annum} For the first six months for the period of
accommodation, and \$150. per annum thereafter.

The Commissioners whose names are on this letter-head desire to have a list of the names of the parties to whom pensions have been paid in England on account of the Newfoundland Regiment, and copies of all papers in relation thereto.

They further desire that, in future cases, any amounts which may be paid by your Department will be described as allowances or provisional pensions, pending approval by the Board here, as there is no authority under the Act for any persons or organization to grant pensions, except the Pension Board itself. The Board does not mean this to be regarded as in any sense critical of the work done by you or your Department heretofore, but is merely calling your attention to the new regulations because of the phraseology of the Act under which the Board is working.

The Board will be glad if you will continue to carry out the work in regard to Pensions undertaken thus far by your office, and trusts that the future working in this respect will be mutually satisfactory.



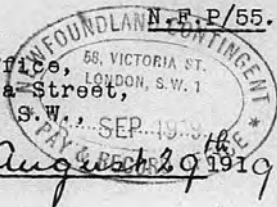

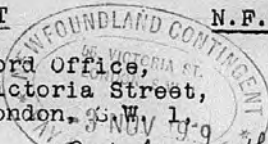

Sir,

Replying to yours of July 21st, which only reached me yesterday, respecting No. 488 Private T. Moulard, I would say that this man, under Canadian pension ratings which we are following, would be entitled to a pension of \$40. a month, as his disability from blindness, not to speak of tuberculosis, would be total, and his condition of blindness would also entitle him to an extra allowance for a help, up to \$250 a year. Our Board accordingly suggests that His Excellency be moved to wire Major Timewell to pay Private Moulard pension at the rate of \$40. a month for himself, and to make an allowance of \$20. per month towards his maintenance in any institution in which he is being cared for; subject, of course, to the right of any permanent Pension Board appointed later to vary this regulation.






