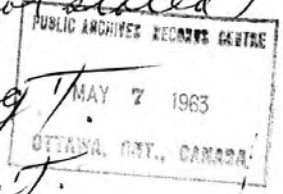

and went Overseas was badly wounded in the hip, returning he has
been discharged and is now ~~receiving~~^{receiving} I am told 24.00 per month as
a pension.

Poor Edgar as he hobbles around is indeed a pitiable
object. He has a wife and one child to share his scanty pension
with. By the time house rent and fuel is paid for it is an easy
matter to spend the balance, especially with flour and substitutes
at such a price. ~~The~~ poor boy ~~seems~~^{tries} to augment his pension by
light work, but it would give anybody pain to see him walk much-
less work. Cannot the Department do something more to help this
lad's distress? If you cannot it will be somebody's business ~~to~~
to appeal to the public on his behalf.

He called to see me yesterday and at his request I am
writing this for confirmation I would refer you to Rev. Edgar
Mercer his pastor.

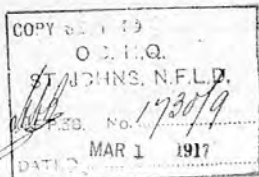

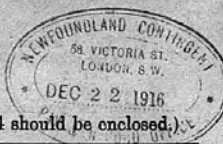

Patent was wounded during a charge on the German trenches. He was taken to one of the Canadian Base Hospitals where wounds were opened up. On admission here there were two wounds open & one healed. The open wounds were regarded as due to one bullet. Abscesses were opened in Rt. Shoulder & hip. He was then X-rayed when two bullets were found in thigh. These were removed on August 8th. The other wounds also healed.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as, in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.
