STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

2909 Pte Kenneth Mugford - Port Albert, Twillingate

Enlisted - June 1916. Proceeded Overseas - August 1916

Company in France - "A" Company

Place & Date of Capture - Masnieres, December 3rd, 1917

Circumstances of Capture - I was a Stretcher-bearer and during the German Counterattack I was down in a dugout bandaging up wounded. I was still at this work ~~xxx~~ when the Germans came over and came into our trench. All the wounded men and myself were then taken prisoners. On our way back towards the German lines I was wounded in the left arm and right shoulder and was taken to a field dressing station just behind their lines.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - For three or four days I was kept in a large Dressing Station about 10 Kilometres away, and was then shifted by train to Munster in Germany. I stayed there in Hospital for about 2 months. The treatment on the whole was fairly good and the only thing we had to complain about was the food, which was very scarce. I was then moved to Saltan for about two months where, after three weeks' convalescence, I was set to work first at a farm and then at a Lumber Yard and I was treated quite well under the circumstances. My next move was to Nottendam for about a month doing Farm work and then to Benerlittel for another month. The food question was the main thing that mattered in both these places; but after the parcels from the Red Cross arrived, conditions were much better. Then I was sent away to another farm, where I stayed until after the Armistice was signed. I was repatriated to England via Hamburg and arrived in Hull a few days after Christmas.

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 12th March, asking if it is possible that parcels might be sent to #2909 Pte. Mugford, who is a prisoner of war. The regulations do not permit of parcels being sent by any but the authorised association. The N.W.C.A. is the authorised association for sending parcels to Newfoundland Prisoners of War. Food parcels are despatched at the rate of three per fortnight, and clothing parcels periodically from the time the man is reported a prisoner.

It is now possible to forward one parcel per quarter, but this is not done under official control, and concerning the regulations I would refer you to the Honorary Secretary The Women's Patriotic Association, who will give you all particulars necessary.

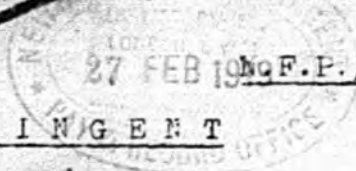

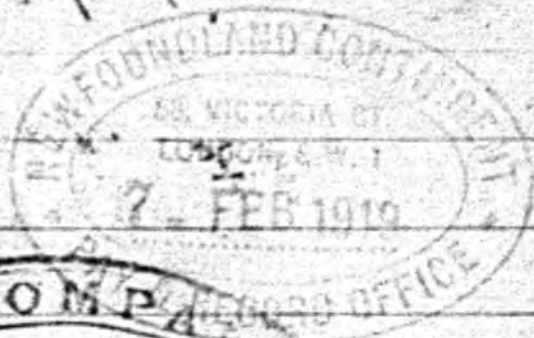

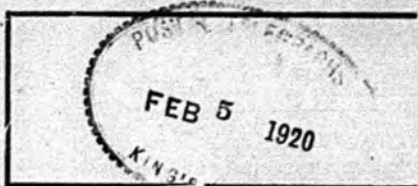
