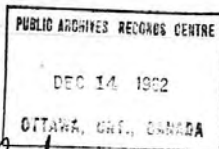

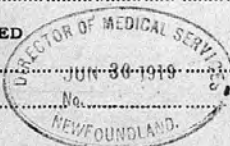

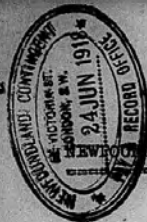

Who said as follows:-

"I am Moses Muise age 25, unmarried. I live at St. Georges. I joined the Royal Newfoundland Regiment in April 1915. I left St. John's for England on June 20th 1915. I was in England and Scotland for six months. I then left for France in January 1916, I went to Beaumont Hamel in France, thence to Belgium and was in engagement of July 1st at that place where I got wounded. I was three months and thirteen days in hospital Molesworth Hospital, England.

I left England (Waterloo Station) for France on 3rd March 1917, and on the 14th April at Monchy I was again wounded and taken prisoner by Germans. I was wounded in the head and back. I was down and unconscious on the ground where I was taken prisoner. I was serving with our fellows in the 88th Brigade of the Twenty Ninth Division at the time. The wounds were from shell fragments. I was sent to Darnsdadt Hospital where I was for between 4 and 5 months. Both my wounds were severe but the one in back of my head was the worse. I got very poor treatment in this place. Both the food and accommodation were bad. I was then sent to work in a factory at a place called Overwallif 266, I was paid at rate of one mark a day for working continually for about twelve and sometimes 13 hours a day. I used to sometimes get some coffee in the morning and some black bread not much. I had an hour for dinner. I got some sort soup and black bread for the dinner, and at night I sometimes got some coffee, and only for some parcels sent us from England I don't think I would have lived. After our days work we were locked up and our accommodations were terrible, where I was, the bunks were of boards and all manner of filth and vermin there before I got to the place it was awful. I had to work or die, I working like this for five or six months until one day I fainted from hunger and constant hard work (Sunday & Monday all alike).

I was then kept in an old barn, where I had to lie on the floor (There was two Russians in same building when I was there) I had no bedding at all and in April it was none too warm sleeping at night (or trying to anyway) I saw no doctor only a sentry who used to bring us some soup or coffee with one piece of black bread about 6 inches long by about 2 inches square this was for the whole day I was nearly starved there. Then after some 14 or 15 days in this old stable barn I was sent into Gliessen and from there to Meshed where I had to work on the land or farms. I was working there for 3 months more or less until the Armistice was signed. I never got one cent for all this time and work. I was poorly fed on the same black bread and soup and coffee. I got this stuff constantly at this place 3 times in 24 hours but I never had enough, and only for a few parcels food from time to time from the folks at Victoria Street, England through the Canadian Red Cross, I should certainly have starved some of the time. We were treated barbarously by the guards and sentrys. They used to pinch me and strike me and others of the prisoners with the butts of their rifles and sometimes with their bayonets and so compel us to do all the work we could and as far as I was concerned I got it bad. Our quarters were then in the German Barracks and I found them better because we had some bedding. I used to almost know when Germans were winning at front as our guards and sentry would be noisy and rejoicing on these times. I and others used to get treatment beaten and maltreated shockingly. After the Armistice I with others was sent to Holland where I got decent treatment, clothes and food, and from Rotterdam I got to Hull, England thence to Ripon thence to Winchester and from there I got home to Newfoundland. I find my head a trouble almost all the time so that I cannot stand noise or heavy work. This is the truth so help me God.

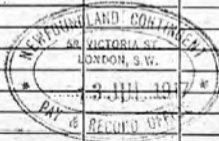
