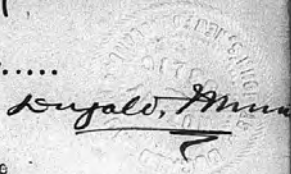



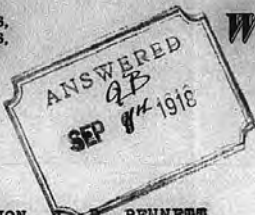

In explanation of telegram from my son, Lionel Munn, handed you yesterday, would say that he had leave of absence from the Regiment on June 24th. for ten days, which he spent in London with Lieut. John Clift and others of the Draft who lately returned to St. John's.

While on leave he was taken sick with Influenza and was in Hospital in London where Doctor Parsons saw him.

The last letter we received from him was Dated July 12th. "In France" where he had just returned from London.

His telegram ^{Sept 3rd} to me states that he has just been discharged from Hospital again, in London, and now attached to the Depot at Winchester.

We believe that he must still be sick and not fit for Active Service, or they would be sending him to the Front again. Possibly his reference to "See Bennett" is to ask you if there is any possibility of his getting furlough to return to St. John's for a Visit while the Regiment is not in the fighting Line.

I am telegraphing to Lionel for further information. If there is a chance of his getting leave to come this way now, please do what you can to help him as it is now approaching Three Years since he left here. I am ready to pay his passage money from England and return if necessary.

I have not yet heard from Lieut. Mann, and will communicate with him again.

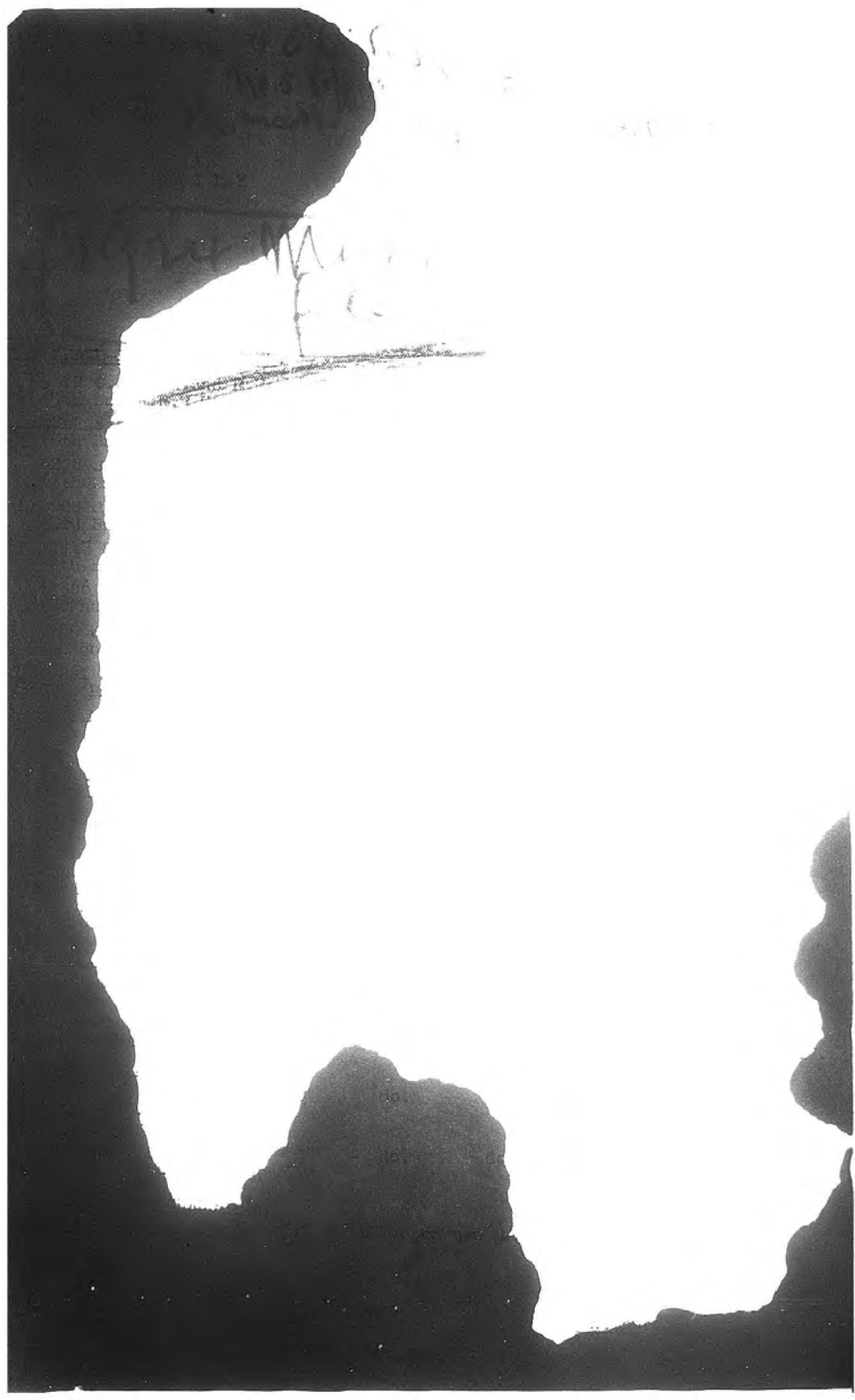

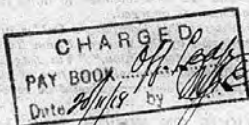
