

I have the honour to submit a claim for \$129.00 (one hundred and twenty nine dollars) being the difference of War Service Gratuity due me in respect of my services with the Newfoundland Contingent.

My service is as follows:-
Enlisted in the Newfoundland Regiment 1/12/14 still
Serving with the D.G.R. & E., Newfoundland Contingent.

In March 1920, whilst holding the rank of Sergeant, I received from the Chief Staff Officer (London), Newfoundland Contingent, the sum of \$420.00 being the authorized amount for three years service up to and including rank of Sergeant i.e.6 months at \$70.00 per month.

On the 21st January, 1920 I was transferred to the D.G.R. & E. Newfoundland Contingent with rank of Sergeant, but was subsequently promoted to rank of Warrant Officer, Class I.

In accordance with War Service Gratuity rulings, I am therefore entitled to 183 days pay at the rate of \$3.00 per day - \$549.00



During my recent visit to Newfoundland I took the opportunity of discussing the subject of Private Medical treatment whilst in the Nfld. Military Service, with the Archivist of the Militia Records, Major J.M. Howley.

To explain more fully as to my case with reference to the afore mentioned subject, I would state that prior to the demobilisation of the Militia Department (31st March 1924) I was fully entitled to receive free medical treatment when required. Not being in touch with the Imperial Military Medical Service at all times during my military service with the D.G. & E. Newfoundland Contingent, you will readily understand that on many occasions I had to call on civilian doctors for attention when necessary for sickness etc. attributable to my war service. Major Howley informed me that I am entitled to a refund of any monies I expended privately in this connection. The total amount paid out in this way I estimate at £10 based as follows:-
