With reference to my letter you of July 9th in relation to two parcels forwarded to No. 3492, L/Cpl. T. Murphy, stated to have been undelivered, I might say that we have continued our investigations in this connection, as intimated in our letter; and on the 18th of July forwarded to the Record Office, London a record of the parcel which was despatched on Sept. 11th, 1917 to Barry Camp, Scotland, with a request that they would have same traced.

Reply has been received from the Chief Paymaster which states that the Postmaster at Barry Camp had been communicated with, and also the Postmaster at Ayr, but no trace or recollection of the parcel referred to could be had from either of these places. It was stated by the Postmaster, Barry Camp that any parcels received by him after the departure of the Regiment from that place, were redirected to the Regiment's Headquarters at Ayr; and if the parcel in question had reached Ayr, it would have been handed over to the Regiment's Post Orderly.



There is no trace or recollection of the parcel referred to here, or at Barry Camp Post Office. If the parcels were received at Barry Camp while the Regiment was stationed there they would be handed over to the Regimental Orderly who called at the Post Office for the letters and parcels.

So far as can be remembered the Newfoundland Regiment left Barry Camp early in October, and all correspondence and parcels received after its departure were redirected to the Regiment's Headquarters at Ayr.
