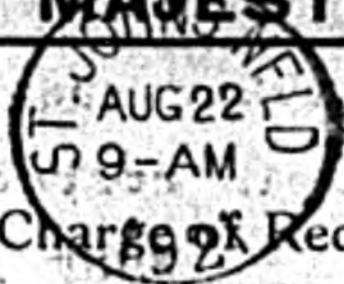

You had already heard of his dangerous illness but we were all hoping that he would recover. It has, however, been willed otherwise and we can only submit to an all-wise Providence.

Your son's name will stand high on the Roll of Honour, as he was among the first of those who gave their lives for their King and Country and the defence of the principles of Righteousness and Justice.

It will I am sure be solace to you to realize that he did his part to the utmost, and his memory will ever be held in honour by those for whom he has given his life.
