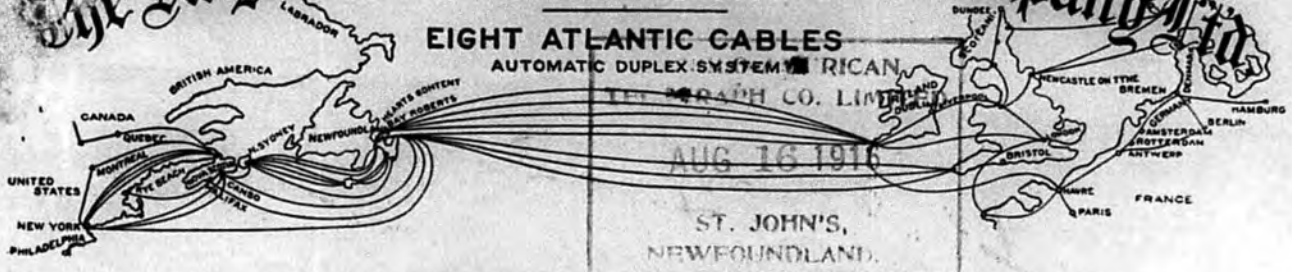

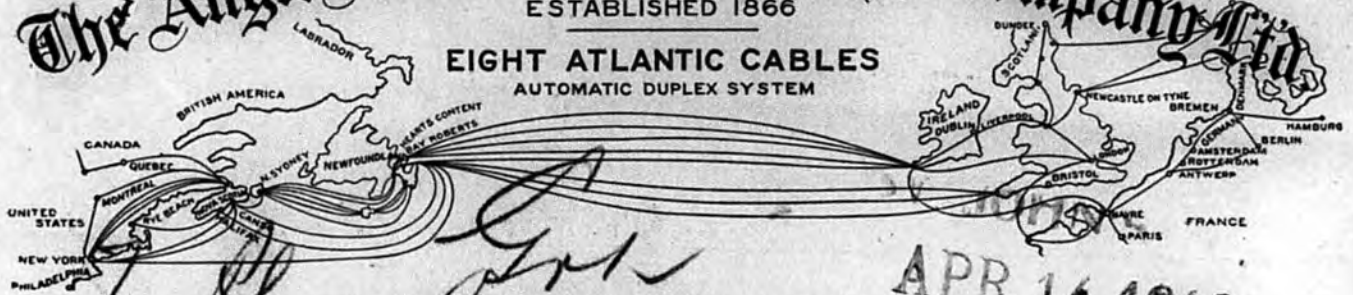

I have no doubt that in the course of a few days Captain Timewell will be in a position to send the effects forward.

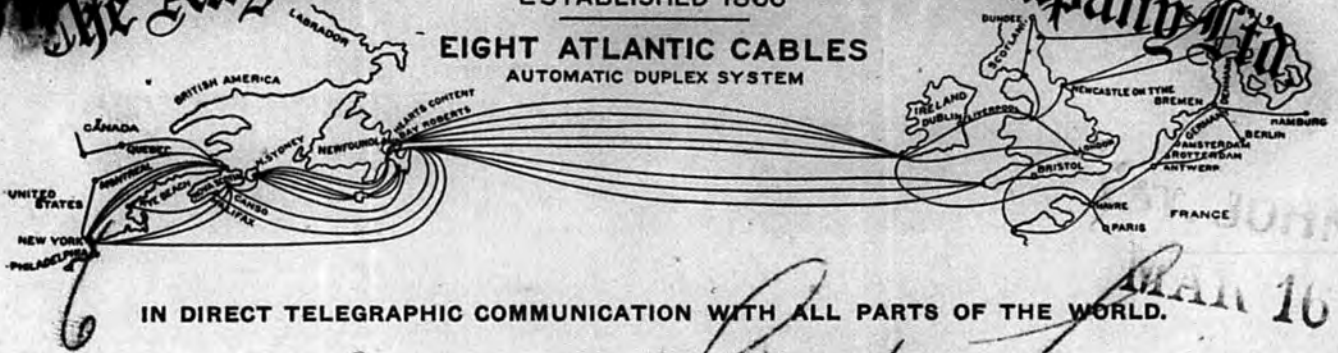
