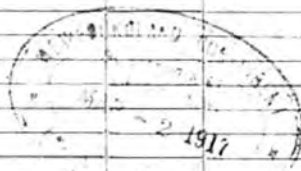

Posteriorly the percussion note is comparatively dull over the supra. spinous fossa and fine crepitations are heard here during inspiration and slightly increased P. P.

Rales are also heard but of a coarser character right-down to base. Sputum is purulent & mucumular and contains ~~Tubercle~~ Tubercle bacilli. Heart sounds pure, but action rapid. Has evening temperatures. Abdominal organs apparently healthy.

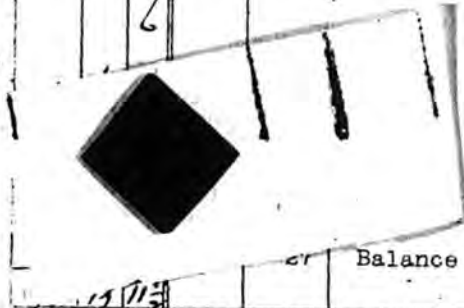

With reference to your Minute 14/5/17: it was proposed to return this soldier to Newfoundland, the opportunities for which are limited, and it is now ascertained that, being a Cot case, passage cannot be arranged for the present; but this office will be advised when the next opportunity occurs.

As the case appears to be a serious one, it is asked that you will be good enough to allow Neville to remain under your care for the time being, or if this is not practicable, he might be transferred to a Sanatorium, possibly Glenafton, Ayrshire.

In this connection I am writing to the O.C. 2nd Battalion, Ayr, to ascertain what can be done.

I am in receipt of your letter 4488/2 HA/RC, of 12th inst. regarding 1343, Pte. G. J. Neville.

It is regretted that your instructions to transfer this man to Ayr cannot be complied with. Neville suffers from Tuberculosis, and in the opinion of the Medical Officer under whose care he is, he is quite unfit to travel to Ayr.

As a matter of fact he has never been out of bed, and he would require to travel on a stretcher. I communicated with Ayr this afternoon pointing out these circumstances, but could get little information apart from the request that the man be sent to Allan's Offices, Liverpool. Such a procedure, however, is not advisable and a more definite arrangement would require to be made. As Neville's disability is of an infectious nature, the Shipping authorities might even refuse to take him on the ship.

As you wish this man transferred on the 17th, I shall be glad if you will kindly telegraph instructions.

2. It is understood at present that his recent history has been as follows:-

- 23.4.17., diagnosed Tubercle of Lung.
- 10.5.17., appeared before a Medical Board in No. 4. Scottish General Hospital, which approved of him being discharged from the Service.
- 23.5.17., transferred to Heathfield Sanatorium, Ayr.
- 31.5.17., his discharge from the Service became automatically effective.

3. Army Form O.1846 was not sent by the O.C. 4th Scottish General Hospital to the Local Government Board, as laid down in A.C.L. 293/17. In explanation of this, this officer stated that he understood that "all arrangements were carried out by the Newfoundland Authorities".

4. In order that this office may be clear as to what has been done in his case, and be satisfied that no further action is required on its part, will you therefore be good enough to reply to the following questions:-

- (1) Are the statements in para 2 correct?
- (2) Is Pte. Neville still in Heathfield Sanatorium?
- (3) If so, who is now responsible for the payment of the charges toward his maintenance there, in view of the fact that he would appear to be no longer a serving soldier?

An early reply to this letter will be much appreciated.

- (3) The question of his maintenance now rests with the Newfoundland Government.

As indicated in documents to be handed you by Major Carty, in charge of this draft, and as will be verbally amplified by that officer, the bulk of the documents were still awaited from the Depot.

At 6.15 last evening a telegram was received from the O.C. 2nd Battn. asking that an additional passage might be booked for 1343, Pte. G.J. Beville, and Major Carty was requested, if Beville did report at Liverpool, to make the best arrangements he could for him.

A number of Soldiers' documents have this moment been received from the Depot. From a brief examination it would appear that it will be impossible to make the necessary copies of the documents and check the accounts in time for mail closing within a few hours.

Among these documents are some for 1089, Pte. S. Penney, which implies that he also formed part of the draft from Scotland. Presumably his name was omitted from the list furnished by the Depot, this being the first intimation of his repatriation. It is hoped that if it is a fact that he accompanied the draft Major Carty was able to arrange his inclusion on the Transport.
