The father of the above-named has written in very strongly to this Department applying for the repatriation of his son.

As this man has been discharged in the United Kingdom we cannot have him repatriated unless the man himself is willing. Please get in touch with this man and find out what his wishes are in this matter.

In his letter the father mentions the son ^{being} married. We have no report of this in our files here. Please verify this statement.

If Pte. Neville wishes to be repatriated would you kindly make the necessary arrangements for his repatriation.

I am enclosing copy of the letter of this man's father in relation to ~~the~~ ^{his} repatriation.

It is regretted that Pte. Neville's whereabouts are unknown in this office, although enquiries have been made.

His War Service Gratuity and other correspondence have been returned to this office, the envelopes marked "not known at this address". Pte. Neville has been a considerable nuisance during his military career, and it is unofficially reported that he was recently arrested in Glasgow for wearing a uniform and decorations to which he was not entitled, and is now serving a term in a Glasgow civil gaol.

He was married on 29/1/18 to a girl in Ayr, but in April last Neville stated that his wife "had run off with an Australian soldier."

Will you please explain the circumstances to Neville's father, and inform him that his son was discharged at his own request in the U.K.? After his discharge, arrangements were, in fact, made for his repatriation by the "Corsican" 22/5/19 but he did not report as ordered. Subsequently he was written to the address he gave, i.e. c/o Mr. Robert Hunter, 175, High Street, Ayr, Scotland and was informed that he could be repatriated at the Government expense; this letter, however, was returned marked "whereabouts unknown." Should anything further be heard of him steps will be taken to repatriate him.

It is possible that he enlisted in some other Corps.

1. Neville has not completed his present engagement plus the additional twelve months required by Section 87-1 of the Army Act. If that Section were adopted in Neville's case his re-engagement would expire 7/1/19.
2. Neville has not completed thirteen years total service.
3. Neville has not attained the age of 41 years according to his attestation. His age on enlistment 7/1/16 was stated to be 18 years.

For your information a
copy of Neville's Attestation

(duplicate) is enclosed.
Please return it to this Office.

It may be added that at the outset the term of enlistment was:

"For the duration of the present War, but not exceeding one year."

With the exception of about 50 men who claimed their discharge, and were discharged after one year's service, the bulk re-engaged "For the duration of the War."

Meanwhile the words "but not exceeding one year" were struck out.



The father of the above-named has written in very strongly to this Department applying for the repatriation of his son.

As this man has been discharged in the United Kingdom we cannot have him repatriated unless the man himself is willing. Please get in touch with this man and find out what his wishes are in this matter.

In his letter the father mentions the son is married. We have no report of this in our files here. Please verify this statement.

If Pte. Neville wishes to be repatriated would you kindly make the necessary arrangements for his repatriation.

I am enclosing copy of the letter of this man's father in relation to the repatriation.

It is regretted that Pte. Neville's whereabouts are unknown in this office, although enquiries have been made.

His War Service Gratuity and other correspondence has been returned to this office, the envelopes marked "not known at this address". Pte. Neville has been a considerable nuisance during his military career, and it is unofficially reported that he was recently arrested in Glasgow for wearing a uniform and decorations to which he was not entitled, and is now serving a term in a Glasgow civil gaol.

He was married on 28/1/18 to a girl in Ayr, but in April last Neville stated that his wife "had run off with an Australian soldier."

Will you please explain the circumstances to Neville's father, and inform him that his son was discharged at his own request in the U.K.? After his discharge, arrangements were, in fact, made for his repatriation by the "Gorseican" 22/5/19 but he did not report as ordered. Subsequently he was written to the address he gave, i.e. c/o Mr. Robert Hunter, 175, High Street, Ayr, Scotland and was informed that he could be repatriated at the Government expense; this letter, however, was returned marked "whereabouts unknown." Should anything further be heard of his steps will be taken to repatriate him.

It is possible that he enlisted in some other Corps.

Please could you in any way help me get back my child that is in Scotland and wanted to get home with the last draft but they refused to take him. 2066 Pte. Ronald Neville. He is joined three years and a half. He has been wounded three times and five times in hospital altogether. He fought and fell for his King and Country -almost 4 years joined up now. He was 16 and 10 months when he joined. He was 20 his last birthday, a child still not out of my care. He is all I got - my only support. I got an invalid daughter aged 20. I am going up for 70 myself, so I don't think it is dealing him fair when all the rest of our boys ~~are~~ brought back to their old parents to leave him behind when he wants to get home with the rest. Being a child and with no education at all he never knew the mistake he was making by getting discharged over there. He was so long in the Regiment and getting tired of it as he was not needed any longer, and not feeling a bit well or strong, he thought he would take his discharge and go to Scotland. I think he was married there last year while on leave and stayed with friends ^{and} when the big draft was coming he would come with them, but when he applied to get home they would not take him.

What I am going to do without him I do not know.

There is another draft coming now the last one, and if you could help him get along this time you would have the best wishes of a broken hearted father and sister.

A cable has been despatched to London to ascertain whether there is any balance.

I regret that I am unable to do anything in the matter of securing a berth for you on one of the sailing steamers, as I am not in touch with any of the merchants concerned. I would suggest that you address a letter to Dr. Blackall, Secretary of the Civil Re-Establishment Committee and ask him whether he is able to do anything for you.

Dear Sir:

With reference to your request to have your son, the above mentioned soldier, repatriated, I have to state that instructions were forwarded to our London Office to this effect. A reply has been received from that Office dated August 9th stating that his whereabouts are unknown there. His War Service Gratuity and other correspondence have been returned the envelopes marked "Not known at this address". Our London Office stated that he was married on the 28th of June 1918 to a girl in AYR, but in April last he stated that his wife had run off with an Australian soldier.

Your son was discharged in the United Kingdom at his own request, and arrangements were made for his repatriation by the S.S. "Corsican" on the 2nd of May, but he did not report as ordered, subsequently he was written to at the address that he gave, namely: C/O Mr. Robt. Hunter, 175 High Street, AYR, and was informed that he could be repatriated at the expense of the Government. This letter however, was returned marked "whereabouts unknown."

Should anything further be heard of him by our London Office they will take such steps as are possible to repatriate him.




