Dear Sir:-

I beg to quote hereunder the details of the deed for which the Military Cross was awarded your son, Lieut. A.S. Newman, Royal Newfoundland Regiment taken from supplement to the London Gazette.

" For conspicuous bravery and initiative.  
" On the 14th. October, during the advance  
" from LEDRICHHEM towards the LYS, a hostile  
" battery of field guns, firing at very close  
" range temporarily held up the attack. 2/Lieut.  
" Newman grasping the situation, at once decided  
" to outflank the battery from the right. He  
" led his platoon forward, and although fired on  
" at point blank range, continued to advance by  
" rushes. When within 500 yards of the battery,  
" his platoon came under intense M. G. Fire, and  
" casualties were becoming so heavy that further  
" progress was impossible. He at once sent  
" a Lewis Gun with two men to outflank the battery  
" from the right, the fire from this gun eventually  
" forced the enemy back to a farm. 2/Lieut. Newman  
" charged back with his platoon, captured the  
" battery, 10 M. G.'s and what was left of the gun  
" crews, one Officer and seven men. He then pushed  
" on to the next farm and captured an ammunition  
" wagon with transport and several more prisoners.  
" By this quick decision and dash he rapidly &  
" cleared up a difficult situation and enabled the  
" advance to be pushed on still farther".

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Please accept my congratulations and assurance of the appreciation of the Splendid conduct of your son.

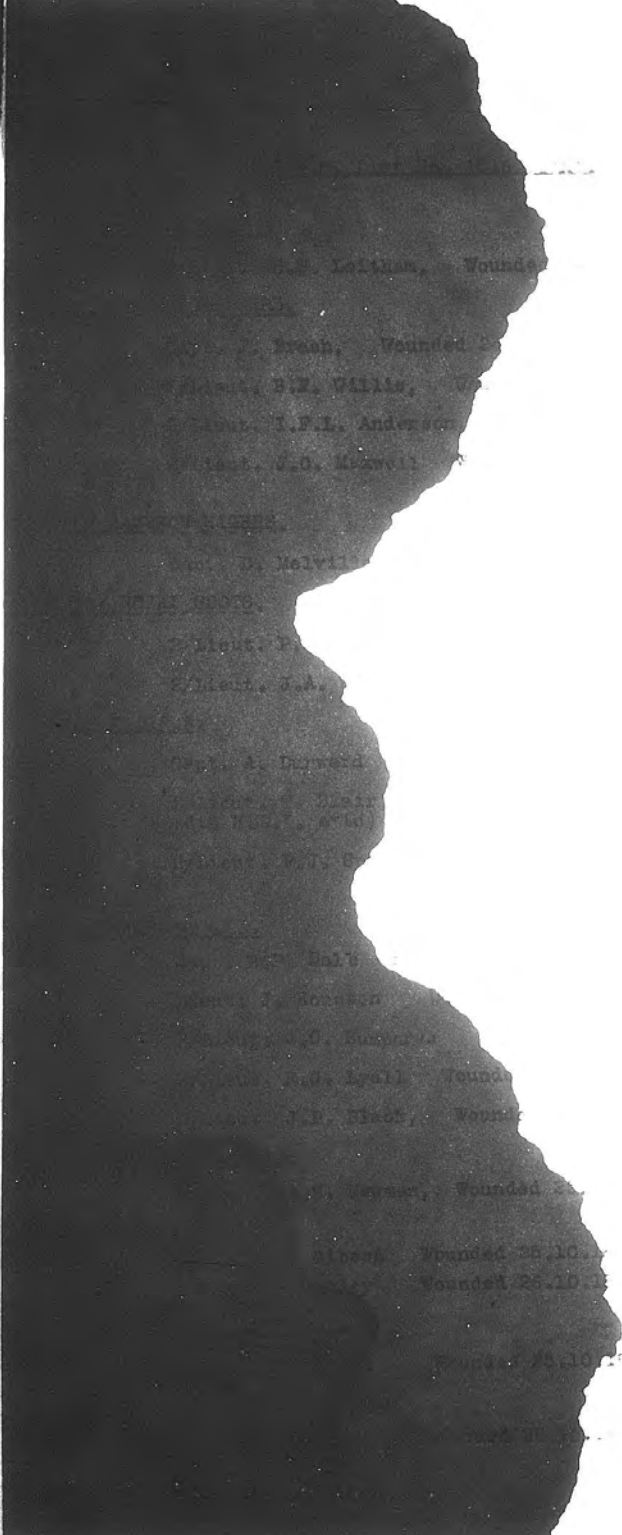

In reply to your telegram of 4th March, "Now awaiting statement of account 2/Lieut. Newman," I am enclosing herewith a copy of account covering the period when this Officer (then non-commissioned Officer) was stationed at Headquarters St. John's.

The following telegram No. 686. 25/5/18 is confirmed. Minutes of correspondence with the Officer concerned is enclosed for your further information. Meanwhile it may be advisable to review the following points,-

Lt. Newman, then 365 Sergeant, embarked from United Kingdom 29/6/16 up to which date he was credited with pay by this Office, Pay and Allowance and Last Pay certificate rendered him. 

My telegram of 22nd Nov. was sent because of the difficulty that presented itself on the possibility of having over one hundred dependents of sold to deal with, with practically no accommodation immediately available. This and other reasons make it advisable that such dependents should come to this either with their husbands after the arrival in this of their husbands.

If this can be arranged no difficulty is foreseen in being able to handle the situation to the satisfaction of all concerned.

subject was further discussed at the  
7th Meeting of the Empire Demobiliza-  
tion Committee, a draft copy of  
which is attached, and from which you  
will observe that the consensus of  
opinion was in favour of repatriating  
dependants with the husbands.

It is now practically certain  
that arrangements will eventually be  
made whereby dependants can accompany  
husbands, but it is obvious that such  
arrangements will be subsidiary  
to the transport of troops, and no  
decision can be given at present as to  
whether dependants will be conveyed to  
Newfoundland before or after the actual  
embarkation of the Contingent. As far  
as this Contingent is concerned the  
number of dependants to be repatriated  
being comparatively small, every endeavour  
will be made to synchronise the repatri-  
ation of dependants with that of Members  
of the Newfoundland Forces. In draft  
No. 79, which proceeded to Newfoundland  
12/12/18 per S. S. "Corsican" there  
were included some eleven dependants  
and it is hoped that similar procedure  
may be followed in the preparation of  
following Drafts.

It is not now proposed to  
circularise dependants as noted in my  
telegram of Nov. 18th, and I hope that  
passages may be secured from time to  
time in accordance with the desires of  
the dependants concerned.


