

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your communication of the 20th. inst., regarding any money that might be payable to Mrs. Nicholle on account of her son #664, C.Q.M.S. Edward Nicholle who was killed in action on Oct. 9th 1917.

I am to request that you inform Mrs. Nicholle that it is regretted that War Service Gratuity is not made payable to the next of kin, it is only made as a personal payment to a soldier on discharge to enable him to recommence his duties in civil life.

Upon enquiry I learn that the estate papers of Sgt. Nicholle have not yet been received from the other side. I am writing the Chief Paymaster requesting him to have these sent out as early as possible, when the estate will be wound up and balance if any will be forwarded to Mrs. Nicholle.

I am enclosing application forms for Separation Allowance and Pension. Kindly ask Mrs. Nicholle to have these filled out and sent on here, as she has not made application for either of these allowances. If there is any money due her on account of either of these claims, it will be forwarded to her.

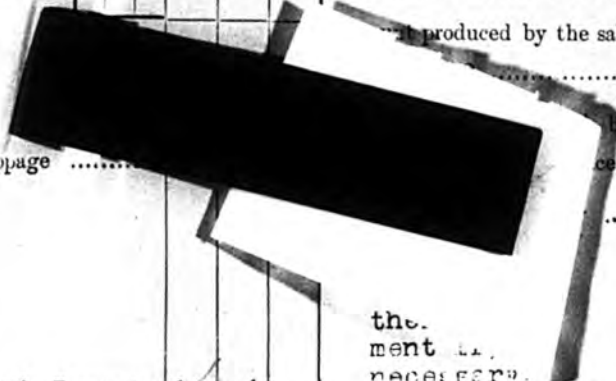


