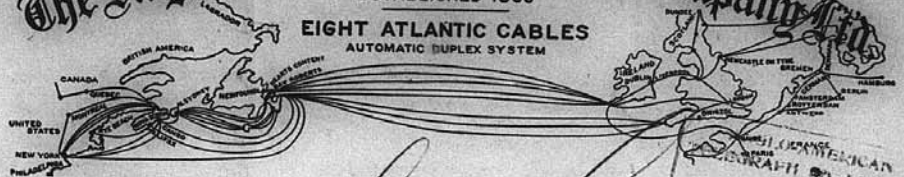

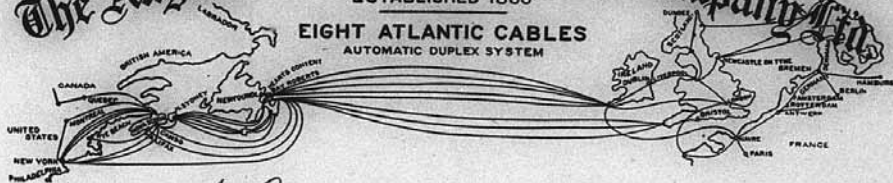



With reference to your letter 28/2/19 (1805): In view of the original notice in the Royal Gazette (Newfoundland) 15/5/17, which was to the following effect:-

"Mr. Albert John Noble,
to be Lieutenant (Honorary and without pay and emolument), while employed as Liaison Officer in London (May 12)."

It is understood that War Service Gratuity will not be issuable. This is also confirmed by the definition of service in the Canadian War Service Gratuity Regulations which states that an officer or man must have been on the strength of a Unit or Administrative Department for Pay and Allowance.

With regard to Outfit Allowance, the Minister of Militia has been asked to give a decision in the matter.




