

Dear Mr. Squires:-

Your letter of April 13th forwarding letter from Mr. J. Noseworthy of 380 Water Street, has been duly received.

Mr. Noseworthy's son, No. 354 Pte. Herman Noseworthy was killed on 1st of July, 1916. The decision of the Pension Board was that no pension was payable to Mr. Noseworthy, for the reason that the deceased soldier was not the sole or main support in accordance with the practice that obtained. When an allotment was left by a soldier who became deceased, to a parent, that allotment was continued by this Department at the request of the Pension Board for a period of no less than two years after date of death (Note- Such payments were refunded by the Board of Pension Commissioners to this Department). In this case the allotment was continued until 28th of February, 1919, which indicates that the Pension Board gave special consideration to Mr. Noseworthy's case (Note- The average allotment was 60¢ per day so that a continuation of payment of allotment to a parent exceeded the total payment of War Service Gratuity which the son would have received if he had returned for discharge).

With reference to the second part of Mr. Noseworthy's letter in which he intimates that he would like his son's body to be sent home, I would point out the policy of the Imperial War Graves Commission has been that it would not be feasible to undertake to return the bodies of any deceased men of the Imperial Army or of the overseas forces; the main difficulties to such a proposal being sanitary condition in the country where such soldiers are buried and consequent danger of spread of disease if wholesale exhumations were to take place, and the very great difficulty of transportation. These are the main practical difficulties. There are other objections from a more sentimental point of view: if the privilege were allowed to one relative to have a soldier's body returned to his home country, a like privilege would have to be granted to all. It would be very difficult to maintain a definite date after which no such requests would be considered. The effect of that one point would be that the work of the Imperial War Graves Commission would not possibly terminate for a considerably longer time than under present arrangements, and the completion of the military cemeteries would be impaired and delayed; and even when any one cemetery was stated to be completed, there would always be the possibility of further exhumations which would upset the whole architectural scheme of that cemetery. As a matter of fact, the records of the Imperial War Graves Commission tend to show that very few applications for the return of bodies have been received, and that those who are very firm in carrying out the policy of the Commission are very firm in carrying out the policy of the Commission, the bodies of British soldiers must remain in their present places of burial. I am returning Mr. Noseworthy's letter herewith, please.
