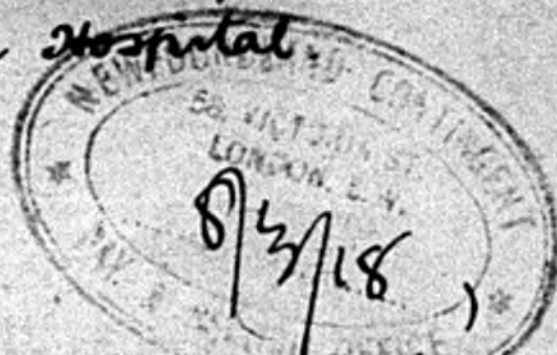




Descriptive Return of a Soldier discharged on account of Disability.

The "Rank," "Station" and "Date" should be in his own handwriting. The form will then be attached to the Proceedings of the man's Medical Board, to be completed by the Officer in Charge when received by him, and will be forwarded by him, together with the remainder of the man's documents, to the Secretary, Royal Hospital, Chelsea, London, S.W.1.
