With reference to this office memorandum 4213/ 15/3/18 further minutes of correspondence relating to Noseworthy together with a brief summary of his case. Judging from the instructions contained in your reply to this office No. 4213 17357/572/P&A, 26/10/18 and 26/12/18 pension is payable only during the period Noseworthy was in hospital although the Medical Board held at Belfast 4/12/17 agreed that his disability was 100 per cent and again Medical Board held 28/4/19, disability was still 100 per cent. Is not Noseworthy entitled to some pension or allowance during the period intervening between the periods of his hospital treatment?

You will observe from the enclosed statement that the allowance issued by the Naval & Military War Pensions Committee, Belfast, are in excess of amount of pension computed by this office for the period this ex soldier was under treatment in hospital.

A.F.B.179 Proceedings of Medical Board held 28/4/19 is enclosed for consideration of the Pension Commissioners. It is asked that his case may be fully reviewed and concise instructions issued to this office as to the amount and period of time pension is payable; also whether pension is to be paid for any period after discharge from hospital.

It must be borne in mind when considering such cases that whereas the pensioner may be reported as being in hospital at a given date, during the interval of time between

In the present case there was quite a delay in reboarding. This was due to the Naval & Military Pensions Committee having changed their address and this office letter being forwarded to the previous one. Arrangements for Medical Boards have now been made with the Ministry of Pensions who require all documents to be forwarded to them four months before the date fixed for the board.

The Naval & Military W.B.C. have been requested not to make any further payments to Noseworthy, as such will in future be made direct by this office. Pending receipt of your instructions \$37.50 per month is being paid to Noseworthy, and adjustment of the account will be made after the Pension Commissioners have considered the case.

With reference to this office memorandum No.4213, 15/3/18 further minutes of correspondence relating to Noseworthy together with a brief summary of his case. Judging from the instructions contained in your reply to this office No. 17357/572/P&A, 26/10/18 and 26/12/18 pension is payable only during the period Noseworthy was in hospital although the Medical Board held at Belfast 4/12/17 agreed that his disability was 100 per cent and again Medical Board held 28/4/19, disability was still 100 per cent. Is not Noseworthy entitled to some pension or allowance during the period intervening between the periods of his hospital treatment?

This matter has been referred to the Board of Pension Commissioners, whose reply there- to was cabled to your Office to-day Aug. 1st. as follows:-

You will observe from the enclosed statement that the allowance issued by the Naval & Military War Pensions Committee, Belfast, are in excess of amount of pension computed by this office for the period this ex soldier was under treatment in hospital.

It must be borne in mind when considering such cases that whereas the pensioner may be reported as being in hospital at a given date, during the interval of time between

the date of admission to hospital, the course of transmission of documents to the Pension Commissioners through this and your office, the instructions of the Pension Commissioners possibly directing that a reboard be held on discharge from hospital is likely to be somewhat belated. When instructing this office to pay pensions to a man whilst undergoing treatment in hospital, The Pension Commissioners should allow for and state whether any payments are to be made for the period following discharge from hospital up to the time of reboard.

In the present case, there was quite a delay in reboarding. This was due to the Naval & Military Pensions Committee having changed their address and this office letter being forwarded to the previous one. Arrangements for Medical Boards have now been made with the Ministry of Pensions, who require all documents to be forwarded to them four months before the date fixed for the board.

The Naval & Military W.P.C. have been requested not to make any further payments to Noseworthy, as such will in future be made direct by this office. Pending receipt of your instructions £37.50 per month is being paid to Noseworthy, and adjustment of the account will be made after the Pension Commissioners have considered the case.



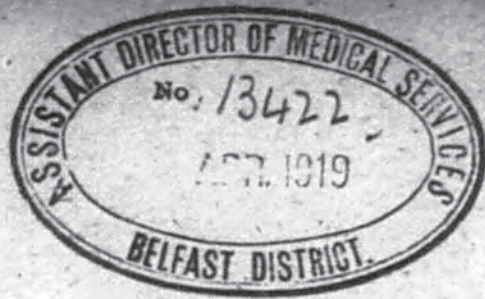

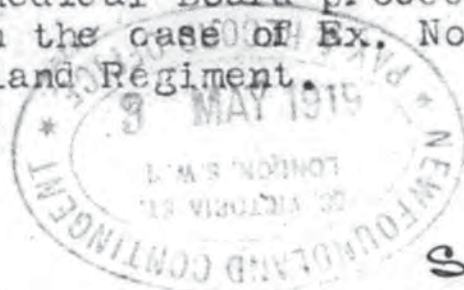

You will see by the above address that I have changed from 39, Gresham Street, to Whitehall Buildings, Ann Street, where your letter reached me on the 22nd. instant.

I beg to report to you that Noseworthy entered the Portrush Convalescent Home on the 18th. December and received payment while there at the rate of £1.14.3 per week for himself and his wife. At the end of January he attempted to commit suicide by drowning himself off the rocks at the back of the Convalescent Home. I had to send his wife to fetch him home to Belfast, where he was laid up for a considerable time, and is still unfit for work.

We have issued Pension at the rate of £1.13.0. per week since his return home.

I am of the opinion that in the course of the next three or four weeks he will again be able to resume his employment on the trams.

I am glad that you have asked the A.D.M.S. to have him reboarded, for it is more satisfactory to have the opinion of an Official Medical Board in cases like this.

I enclose you a full list of payments made in this case.

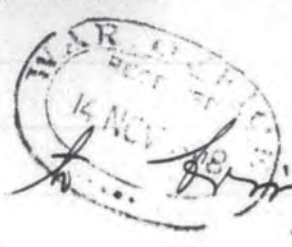

Noseworthy would not remain any longer in Hospital and at my request, the Tramway Committee have given him a light out-door job, for which he will receive no wages until this week.

Up until the present time Noseworthy's Bill in Hospital has amounted to £20, all but a few shillings, and in addition to this his wife received 13/9 per week. I do not know why Mrs Beattie should write to you in this strain, as independent to the Official connection, my Mother has been exceedingly kind to Mrs Beattie and her other children. From the letters that are passing between them and your Office I am afraid they are trying to get more than what is their due. I enclose you a full statement of what they have had from us since we took the case on, so you may see for yourself that there has been no cause for complaint on their part.

You will see by the above address that I have changed from 39 Gresham Street to Whitehall Bldgs, Ann Street where your letter reached me on the 22nd inst. I beg to report to you that Noseworthy entered the Portrush Convalescent Home on the 18th December and received payment while there at the rate of £1.14.3. per week for himself. At the end of January he attempted to commit suicide by throwing himself off the rocks at the back of the convalescent Home. I had to send his wife to fetch him home to Belfast where he was laid up for a considerable time and is still unfit for work. We have issued pension at the rate of £1.13.0 per week since his return home. I am of the opinion that in the course of the next three or four weeks he will again be able to resume his employment on the trams. I am glad that you have asked the D.M.S. to have him reboarded for it is more satisfactory to have the opinion of an official Medical Board in cases like this. I enclose you a full list of payments made in this case.

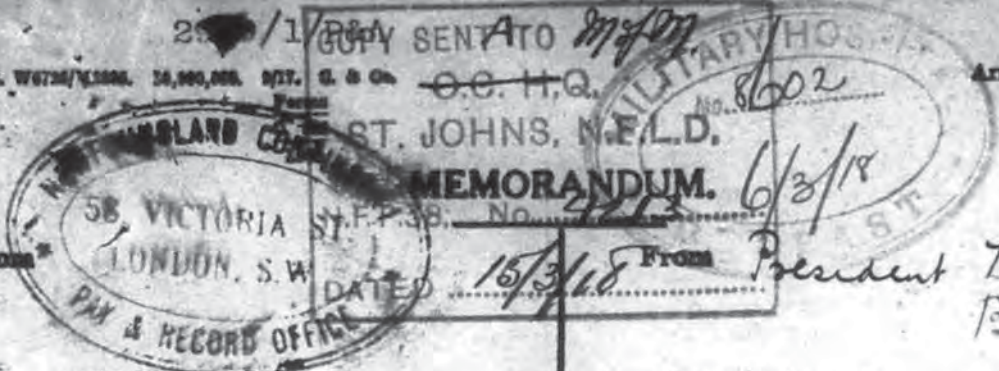



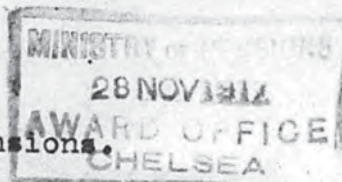

I trust you will forgive the liberty I take in writing you to see if there could be anything done for me and my wife as we are very badly off. I was discharged on the 27th of January last, just after I arrived in St. John's from Ayr. I have never had any pension and am quite unfit for work and the relief funds here will do nothing for me and my wife and myself are wholly dependent on my wife's mother, who is a soldier's widow with a pension of 18/9 per week. I may also tell you my wife is in bad health and I have been in hospital. I tried to work in the country with a Captain Corry but had to give it up. I am sure if the boys knew how I was situated they would give each a little towards keeping myself and my wife out of the work house. I was before a board of doctors at Victory Barracks last Wednesday and they said I was quite unable to work and they would do their best for me, but Sir I thought in the meantime if you or the boys could do anything for me if it was ever as little I would be so grateful to you and them.
