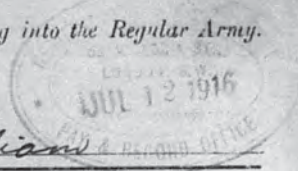

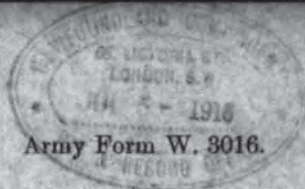

It appears that when the bodies of the soldiers who were buried in isolated or scattered graves in the area in which the above-mentioned were reported buried, that is about one mile N.E. from Langemark, Belgium, (approximately Sheet 20.U.17.b.6.3) were being removed to Cement House Cemetery, the graves of these three soldiers could not be identified. Subsequent military operations caused the destruction of crosses and graves registration marks and completely changed the surface of the ground, so that the work of identifying even those graves of which the position was accurately known has been extremely difficult.

There were five Newfoundland soldiers buried at this spot, two of them were identified on exhumation and as the bodies of some Unknown Newfoundland Soldiers were also found, it is believed that three of these unknown graves are of the above-named soldiers.

Instructions have therefore been issued for Special Crosses to be erected in Cement House Cemetery bearing the above-mentioned soldiers' names and regimental particulars and the following inscription "Believed to be buried in this Cemetery".

It is much regretted that more satisfactory information is not available and it is feared that the action taken is the best possible



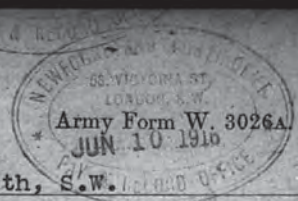

The nature of the casualty is required for telegraphing details overseas. If the details given are insufficient, reference back to the hospital for further information is rendered necessary. The following instructions should therefore be carefully followed in all Colonial cases:

- (a) In the case of sickness, the nature and degree should be stated, e.g., enteric, slight.
- (b) In the case of wounds, the nature of the wound, the part of the body affected, and the severity of the injury should be stated, e.g., gunshot, skull, severe.

If a limb has been amputated the fact should be recorded.

Admissions to the outlying sections of the hospital should be shown separately. If the distance of these sections should render it impossible to forward the rolls the day after the admissions, the sections should be instructed to send lists (on these Army Forms) direct to the War Office, and to the Colonial Contingent Record Office concerned.

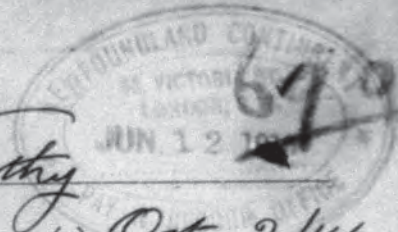
