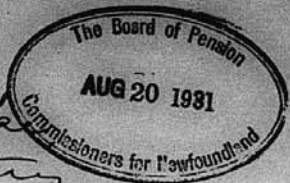

With further reference to my report of the above named pensioner, dated Jan. 10. 1931, I bag to recommend for your favourable consideration, what I then implied, that he be under full disability up to the time of his return to Newfoundland from The South of England, where he was convalescing after his illness of the previous winter: ( Nov. to Feb. ) and I do so for the following reasons:-

- (a) He practically got out of bed to go.
- (b) When seeking medical advice in May 1930, Dr. Masterman Wood, Torquay, prescribed the continuation of diet, rest and graduated exercise laid out for him on going.
- (c) On his return, after examination, he was advised to proceed to work, only within certain narrowed limits of exertion and to take full use of leisure time for rest, even then he had to remain at home on several occasions during the Fall.
- (d) Finally, had he attempted to work while in England, I believe he would have been un-

From November 12, 1929 to February 14, 1930 - the last official medical visit of Dr. Knight - I was confined to bed suffering from weakness of Heart muscle under Dr. Knight's care, when he ordered me to the South of England to recuperate. While there I was carrying out Dr. Knight's instructions as to diet, rest and amount of exercise. During May 1930 it was necessary to consult a physician. I was carefully examined by Dr. Masterman-Wood, of Torquay, who advised that continuation of treatment was necessary.

This I did until August when I returned to St. John's and Dr. Knight again examined me, finding that though apparently improved in health it was necessary to be careful in amount of work that I did, going up stairs only on necessity, going and coming to work by car, and resting as completely as possible during leisure hours. Even then I had to give up work for a few days during the Fall.

I therefore make claim for full compensation up to August on my return to Newfoundland - because I was still under medical supervision and unable to attend to any portion of my work.

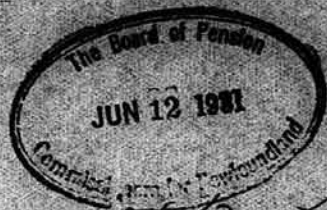

I have consulted with  
my medical Doctor,  
Major J. St. P. Knight, O.B.E.,  
in regards to your letter  
and I beg to say that the  
above, Dr. Knight, was in full  
charge of my case until

my work, but I go very slow

I find you cover a period of 3 months to February 12<sup>th</sup> 1930, I did not leave this country before Feb. 21<sup>st</sup>, when Dr. Knight, was agreeable for me to proceed, all the time in England, I was still carrying out the orders of Dr. Knight, and on my return he gave me a final examination and he stated on the certificate that I had to still be very careful.

This is to certify that the above named was under my care suffering from weakness of Heart muscle from November 12. 1929, to February 14. 1930.

During the whole of this period he was unable to attend to his occupation, and for the major part of the time he was confined to bed.

Subsequent to latter date he, without having been out of doors previously, left for the South of England to recuperate, returning very much improved in general health on or about the middle of August 1930.

Since then he has been able to attend to business daily with only one or two intermissions, taking care to avoid even moderate exertion and resting as completely as possible during leisure hours.

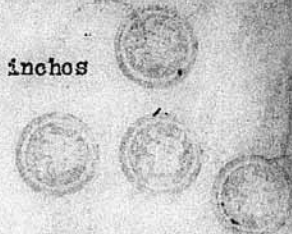

"In arranging for passage of 'F' Company per H.M.S. 'Calgarian,' it was necessary to supply hammocks and bedding for the men.

"250 hammocks and 250 pairs blankets went forward with the Company. I shall be glad if you will arrange for Lieut. Nunns to account for same.

"The hammocks were received from the Commanding Officer of H.M.S. 'Calypso,' who wishes them returned at the earliest opportunity.

"It is possible that this may reach you before the arrival of the 'Calgarian,' and if you can obtain any information regarding her movements you might be able to advise Lieut. Nunns with regard to the return of the hammocks.





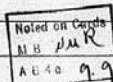

We arrived here Saturday night July 10th, we had some delay in Liverpool waiting for Transport Officer, but got clear of steamer about noon, arriving here about 6-30 to find they had received no official notification, I had wired them from Liverpool, we arrived before the wire, I gather from what the Colonel said they never heard anything official.

The men are in fine condition, we left one man on board, Wilson Bishop #1597, but he was in a very satisfactory condition when we left, I was very nervous over him for two days during the crisis.

The Colonel has made no remarks to me about the men, but he seems pleased to have them.

The behaviour crossing was good, the only trouble I had was Sumner Richardson & I warned him 4 times, the third time I brought him before Capt. I am not at all afraid of these men showing up good, they landed a fine looking body & healthy bunch of men.
