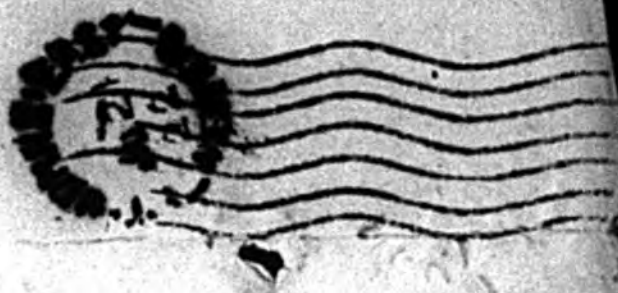



I herewith beg to claim the sum of £5. 15-0, being sum paid by me on board S. S. Corsican on January 31st, for transfer of my wife, Christina Ousley, from Steerage to Cabin, as per enclosed receipt.

My claim is based primarily on the fact that the steerage accommodation on that boat was not fit for such a journey, & in fact the O.C. Troops on board confirmed this; secondly I now learn that several sergeants, who landed here on March 24th, & April 18th, respectively, travelled Cabin with no extra charge. I, being a sergeant (confirmed) therefore contend that my wife was entitled to travel cabin without charge.

I shall be much obliged if you will give this matter your kind attention & let me hear from you.
