### All Messages Sent are Subject to the Following Conditions:

The Management may decline to forward the Message, though it has been received for transmission ; but in case of so doing shall refund to the Sender the amount paid for its transmission.

"The marginally noted is a Canadian who served in the Newfoundland Forces from August 12th, 1915, to Oct. 15th, 1918. He was wounded in France and gassed; he now has T.B. and I have just arranged to send him to the New Haven Sanatorium. He was given a pension of \$25.00 per month from the Newfoundland Government, but has not received it since March.

Would you be good enough to get in touch with the Newfoundland authorities and have this matter straightened out. This poor chap had neither food nor raiment when I saw him. A number of our friends here got together and fixed him up, rather than have the people of this country know how he had been used."
