Dear Mr. Oko,

I have read and given consideration to your letter of the 26th instant. In your place, I would let the lad go if he is medically fit for active service. He will reproach himself for the rest of his life if he did not at length offer to volunteer in the service of his King and Country.

He called on me on the 27th and I sent him with a letter to Dr. L. Paterson to find out if he was medically fit for service. If he is, the non-Combatant Selection Committee (of which Dr. Paterson is a member) would advise me as to what service he is fit for.

On their recommendation I would make application to the Army Council for a vacancy. That will take six weeks but it is doubtful whether the Army Council will accept him for the Motor Transport or Flying Corps. Both were 'full up' when last they wrote; and recently they refused a good mechanician.

My

My own advice is that your son should join the Regiment and apply for transfer when at the Depot at Ayr, if he wished to join a special Corps. He would get a better chance when on the spot. Anyhow the physical training would do him a world of good and set him up and probably make a strong man of him. A year or two would be well spent in establishing his constitution.

All Messages Sent are Subject to the Following Conditions:

The Management may decline to forward the Message, though it has been received for transmission; but in case of so doing shall refund to the Sender the amount paid for its transmission.

In case the Message shall never reach its destination by reason of any neglect or default of the N. P. T. or its Servants, whilst the Message remains under the control of the N. P. T., they will refund the amount paid by the Sender for such Message.

The N. P. T. shall not be liable to make compensation beyond the amount refunded as above for any loss, injury, or damage arising or resulting from the non-transmission or non-delivery of the Message, or delay or error in the transmission or delivery thereof, howsoever such transmission, non-delivery, delay, or error shall have occurred.

The control of the N. P. T. over the Message shall be deemed to have entirely ceased for the purposes of these Conditions at any point where, in the course of the transit of the Message to its destination, it may be entrusted by the N. P. T. (and the N. P. T. shall have full power so to entrust the Message) for further transmission by or through any system, service, or line of Telegraph belonging to or worked by any administration or authority not controlled by the N. P. T. exclusively, although worked as part of or in connection with the Telegraphic system or service of the N. P. T.

Your letter of the 13th. inst. together with medals received, and in reply I beg to say that the rank inscribed on your medals is correct. Permit me to quote for your information the following regulations governing the issue of the British War and

Victory medals: 'Individuals entitled to the British War medals only the same will be inscribed with the highest rank, whether substantive, acting or temporary, held Overseas. Individuals entitled to the British War and Victory medals the same will be inscribed with the highest rank, whether substantive, acting or temporary, recorded as having been held in a theatre of war for any period whatever unless reverted for misconduct. To qualify for the above medals individuals must have served in the Great War between the 4th. of August, 1914, and the 11th. of November, 1918.'

Thus you will observe that the highest rank held by you in a theatre of war was Acting Sergeant,
