I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of communication re the marginally noted man at Jensen Camp, together with letter to you from the Honorary Secretary, Jensen Camp Board of Control.

I feel sure you will agree with me that the whole proceeding thus far has been very much out of order.

The only justification offered for calling in the police in the matter is the statement that "most of the patients are not on the Strength". As a matter of fact thirteen of the patients at Jensen Camp are on the Strength and five only are pensioners.

You are aware that this department has at present no control whatsoever over the affairs of Jensen Camp, and that our appointed representative, Major Paterson, has had to withdraw owing to the fact of his not being able to carry out the proper discipline and treatment owing to interference on the part of the Committee. Having no control the department can, of course, take no responsibility.

I understand from the correspondence that a police investigation has been held already at Jensen Camp. Anything more detrimental to the welfare of Tubercular patients than excitement of this sort it is hard to imagine.

I am asking Major Paterson, late medical officer of Jensen Camp, for a statement of Oliver's condition and if, in his opinion, he is physically fit for such enquiries to proceed.

You state that you wish to have a military representative present for any examination that may be made of this man. By that do you mean a ~~combatant~~ ^{baton} Officer, or will Major Paterson's presence fill the requirements?
