

The Soldier named claims Separation Allowance as the sole support of his widowed Mother. She has eight sons and one daughter, all of whom are married, and between them do not contribute more than 3s.0d. per week towards their Mother's maintenance.

It is stated that the above Soldier has been her support since his Father's death, 31/5/10. He contributed 3s/- towards her maintenance, including the cost of his board, which is estimated at say 1s/- per week, makes a net contribution of 1s/- per week. Since his enlistment she has received his allotment of 2s/- per week.

The Claim was submitted to your department with this Office No 2448/106/P.A. 14/2/18, but no decision has reached this Office. The only estimation that the Claim may have been received was a telegram from Military, 5/6/18, requesting that the outstanding Claim be referred to you on your arrival. As your short time here did not permit of your going fully into these various Claims, they are now specially recommended for your early consideration on your return to Newfoundland.

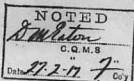

It is stated that the above Soldier has been her support since his Father's death, 31/5/10. He contributed 3s/- towards her maintenance, including the cost of his board, which is estimated at say 1s/- per week, makes a net contribution of 1s/- per week. Since his enlistment he has received his allotment of 2s/- per week.

The Claim was submitted to your department with this Office No 2442/106/P&A. 14/2/18, but no decision has reached this Office. The only estimation that the Claim may have been received was a telegram from Military, 5/6/18, requesting that the outstanding Claim be referred to you on your arrival. As your short time here did not permit of your going fully into these various Claims, they are now specially recommended for your early consideration on your return to Newfoundland.

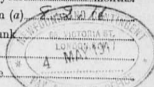
