## Cable Connection with all the World

### All Messages Sent are Subject to the Following Conditions:

The Management may decline to forward the Message, though it has been received for transmission; but in case of so doing shall refund to the Sender the amount paid for its transmission.

In case the Message shall never reach its destination by reason of any neglect or default of the N. P. T. or its Servants whilst the Message remains under the control of the N. P. T., they will refund the amount paid by the Sender for such Message.

The N. P. T. shall not be liable to make compensation beyond the amount refunded as above for any loss, injury, or damage arising or resulting from the non-transmission or non-delivery of the Message, or delay or error in the transmission or delivery thereof, howsoever such transmission, non-delivery, delay, or error shall have occurred.

The control of the N. P. T. over the Message shall be deemed to have entirely ceased for the purposes of these Conditions at any point where, in the course of the transit of the Message to its destination, it may be entrusted by the N. P. T. (and the N. P. 

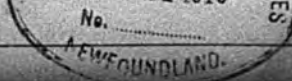

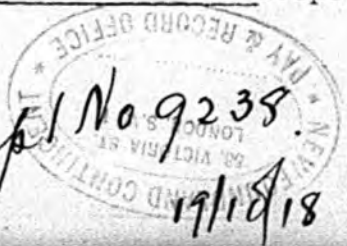

I beg to quote hereunder the details of the deed for which the DISTINGUISHED CONDUCT MEDAL was awarded your son, #3481 Private James O'Quinn, Royal Newfoundland Regiment, taken from supplement to the London Gazette.

"On the 29th. Septmeber 1918, during the attack on REIBERG RIDGE, he voluntarily went forward 100 yards in advance of his company, to reconnoitre thick grass and bushes in front. He came upon three enemy snipers, all of whom he bayoneted.

Later on he carried an important message back to Battalion Hdqrs. through heavy Machine Gun Fire and shell fire. In the afternoon of the same day, although wounded, he carried on with his platoon, until he fell, weak from loss of blood.
