Sir:-

I have the honour to request now, that the Canadian rates of pay have been enforced in the Newfoundland Regiment, that re-adjustment be made in the rate of pay which I have received on embarking with the Regiment from here in March 1917.

At that time I was paid at the rate of \$2.60 per day for a period of 35 days. But as you will notice, the Canadian Medical rates of pay allow \$5.00 per day plus Subsistence allowance. During that time I was not entitled to Subsistence Allowance and therefore, balance of \$2.40 per day would bring pay of Medical Officer in the Newfoundland Regiment up to the Standard now maintained.

I might add that Lieutenant's pay has always been the same in the Canadian Army Medical Corps as that of Captain, which holds also temporary commission in the R. A. M. C.

I spoke to Col. Rendell about this matter and he informed me that he would give it his consideration provided it met with your approval.

Trusting you will be able to adjust this matter for me.



Sir:

I have the honour to submit herewith my resignation of the position as Assistant to Dr. Brehm which I have held now for the past eleven months.

I took this position following a conference in your office between Dr. Brehm, Col. Bernard, yourself and myself, and then it was arranged that I should assist Dr. Brehm and the matter of payment would be decided upon later. Since that time, in addition to my Military work, I have carried out this position to the best of my ability, and it entailed on many occasions, trips to the Suburbs of the City, such as Outer Cove, Bread Cove, Bay Bulls, Big Pond, Pouch Cove and other outlying settlements, where I had to undertake the treatment of cases of smallpox, diphtheria and chickenpox, also I had to carry out the quarantine regulations, and in many cases make periodical visits, as well as to release them from quarantine.

In addition to this I have had to travel to different parts of the town in connection with the Public Health Work, taking bleeds for tests and vaccinations, and taking throat cultures in some of the Institutions, such as Field College Hall (50-60 cultures) and Belvidere Orphanage (130 cultures) on many occasions.

During the latter part of last Summer when Dr. Campbell was away from St. John's, I, in addition to other work, had to attend to the Fever Hospital every alternate day, thus doing work

which Dr. Campbell had been carrying out as Medical Attendant at that Institution, and very often I was called to the Hospital on Emergency cases.

I might state that I acted in the same capacity with the previous Government and received remuneration at the rate of \$250 per month. I am therefore enclosing bill for services rendered during the past eleven months, at the rate of \$200 per month, and am entrusting the matter to my brother, Mr. C. J. Cahill, Barrister, to forward to you, as I am proceeding to England by the "Sachem" which leaves to-day, and I have had no opportunity to take up this matter with you myself.

Trusting you will give this your favourable consideration and have it placed before the Executive Council as soon as possible.

Dear Mr. Cahill:

Your letter of the 18th with enclosures from Dr. O'Reilly is a very great surprise to me.

The position was this: - The Militia Department desired assistance which could be rendered only by two men in Newfoundland, Dr. Brahm and a doctor at Grand Falls. The Department put up a proposition to me to the effect that if I would arrange so that Dr. Brahm be lent to the Department of Militia for a portion of his time, the Department of Militia would lend to the Public Health Department one of their doctors to handle the work that Dr. Brahm would not be able to handle because of his attention to Militia work. Dr. Brahm was to draw his salary as Public Health Officer for the Colony and Health Officer for St. John's just the same, and the Militia doctor was to draw his salary as Militia doctor just the same; it was merely an exchange of work in the interests of the Department of Militia. So far as Dr. Brahm is concerned, he will probably receive some honorarium

from the Department of Militia as an expression of their appreciation of the fact that he was prepared to extend them this courtesy. In the case of Dr. O'Reilly, he called to see me several times during the past few weeks, and I arranged that he should receive an honorarium of between \$250.00 and \$300.00.

When Dr. O'Reilly called he said absolutely nothing about any claim of the sort, and the first intimation that I have that Dr. O'Reilly expected to draw two salaries is this letter I have before me. Dr. Brehm is just as much entitled to be paid two salaries as is Dr. O'Reilly.

With respect to Public Health work, Fever Hospital, etc., I know nothing of that matter. If that reasonably comes within the scope of what Dr. Brehm would himself attend to if he had no connection with the Department of Militia, then it is not within the scope of special remuneration so far as Dr. O'Reilly is concerned. This has only recently been issued, and a copy has been mailed to you under separate cover. This, together with copies of the Canadian Pay & Allowance Regs., 1916, and Instructions governing Organisation & Administration, 1916, mailed to H.E. the governor 8/8/16 should be of useful reference.





The matter of your communication of April 20, respecting Lieuts. J. B. O'Reilly and W.D. Stenlake, was allowed to stand over until the return here of the Chairman, Hon. Sir E. R. Bawling, and at a meeting last night this material was submitted for consideration. He remarked with reference to the allowances of \$25 made uncertain cases for the transport of officers from Ayr to London taking office in the Chaplains' Department or Medical Department, that you had travelling warrants available for these officers which would ensure them of transport without having to pay for it, and he thought it was desirable that we should know whether any intimation had been given to these officers, that such facilities were available and might be utilized by them. It was also agreed that I should invite a suggestion from you as to a regular scale in such cases, in view of the fact that we do not know the travelling charges or the usual period for which these officers have to remain in London before acceptance by the Departments in which they desired employment.

The desire of the Committee is to be as fair to them as possible, so as not to impose any undue strain on their finances, but at the same time it is not our intention that any person sent overseas to undertake duty with branches of the Service apart from the Newfoundland Regiment, should be supplied with funds by the Colony for an indefinite period.
