I have the honour to state that I have received a request from Mr. S.J. Tucker of the Horwood Lumber Co., Ltd., asking for the "War Office Certificate of Death" of No. 306, L/Cpl. D. McNeil Osmond.

As referred to in my No. 491/26, these are forwarded to Your Excellency as received, and it may be advisable to review the circumstances:- In cases of A.F. B.2090A the practice is: the O. i/c Reg. Inf. Records, 3rd Echelon, follows the procedure applying to a British Unit, which is to forward the Original to the War Office and the Duplicate to this; the result being that the Duplicate is received here in due course and the Original, which does not concern the War Office since it does not keep the Records of this Contingent, is also forwarded here-in time. By this process it is usually about two to three weeks before the Original is received, and I am endeavouring to have this amended, with the effect that both the Originals and Duplicates together with Wills, if any, may be sent here direct; so that maintaining the principle of not risking Original documents to Newfoundland, it will be possible to retain the actual Original here and send you an original Duplicate.
