

Dear Sir,

Your letter of July 30th reached me to-day and I am very sorry to hear that your son Lieut. Norman Outerbridge is reported wounded and missing since our attack on April 14th. Your son was in charge of No. 15 Platoon, "D" Co. and I was in charge of No. 14 Platoon, hence was in a position to see some of the mornings My platoon went over the top in the first wave, we being doings. the left of our battalion. Your son's platoon was in the second wave which would be about 30 or 40 yards behind mine. After we had advanced close on 300 yards our ranks had become considerably thinned. All our officers had been knocked out with the exception of Mr. Norman, and he was wounded in the leg, he however did not flinch, but with the pluck and bravery becoming an English Officer he rallied the remainder of good old "D" Company and limping, he gallantly led us on our way. After progressing another 100 or 150 yds we received the full force of the enemy's machine gun fire, and were forced to take cover. On again rising and moving forward your herois son was not with us and I concluded that his wound had become too much for him and that he had rested, however I did not see any more of him, and on being captured some time afterward. I made enquiries of the men belonging to "D" Coy., but they could Your son's actions on that memorable give no other information. morning will forever remain in the minds of those who were with him as his courage and perseverance inspired us all in the face of great odds, but our little band (we numbered scarcely ...) were eventually surrounded by the enemy and forced to surrender. During the day the Germans brought in many of our wounded and perhaps Lieut Norman may be amongst the number. I trust such is the case and that you have heard better news ere now. There were .... of the Nfld Regt. captured unwounded. They are now distributed in various working camps and whilst at first conditions were not of the best they have vastly improved and we are becoming comfortable. In this camp with me are two other Nflds, No. 523 Pte Smythe and 2214 Pte Hudson. They work each day and are quite well. Sergts. I am in and Corpls. do not work but are in charge of parties. charge of 50 men who work at an electric plant and whilst the work is interesting it also helps to pass the time away. We are locking forward to receiving our parcels and we would be much obliged if the good people at home would send along some magazines We are allowed to write two or papers printed before the war. letters monthly and a postcard each week, so in case our people at

home do not get news often they can understand matters.

## Prisoners of War.

I have just received your letter of yesterday's date.

The only Hogan that is known by the Pay & Record Office to be in Switzerland is 2252 Pte. B.J. Hogan, Hotel Alpenruh, Murren. This is apparently the man that Vaughan mentions. The Hogan that wrote to Sir Joseph is 1111 Pte. P.J. Hogan, No. 71931, Offizier Gefangenenlager, Clausthal am Harz, Germany. No application was made for his (1111 Hogan's) transfer to Switzerland or England and he is presumably still in Germany.

The address of 1255 Pte. B.G. Hann is Kriegsgefangenen-Stammlager, Friedrichsfeld bei Wesel, Germany. It was known that Hann was a prisoner of war last July when it was stated he was "registered at Limburg." It was only comparatively recently that a definite address reached this Office. This is the only Hann amongst the Newfoundland prisoners. He was not stated to be wounded.

I am afraid I heard nothing of Crummey's story before you told me. His address now is 2965 L.Cpl. R.J.Crummey, C/o Headquarters, Royal Nfld Regt., St. John's, Nfld. His father's address is stated to be Wm. Crummey, Western Bay, Nfld.

I am sorry to say that for official purposes 1692 Cpl. K.S. Newell was presumed dead on 17/11/17, thirty weeks having elapsed since he was posted as missing, and no information having reached this Office to show that he might be a prisoner of war or was alive.

I am always pleased to give you all the information in my power. As I am sometimes out of town, however, and in order to ensure that your letters get immediate attention by the Office, I would like to suggest that they should be addressed to the Chief Paymaster & Officer i/c Records, Newfoundland Contingent, 58 Victoria St., London, S.W. 1.






