

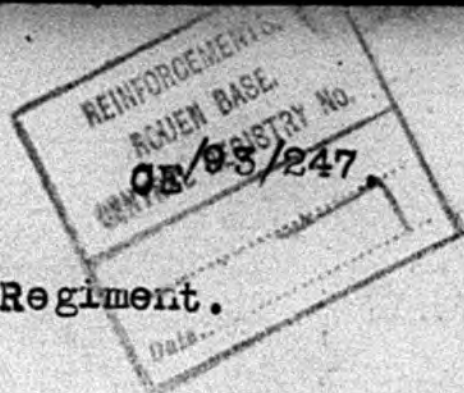



Sir. I beg to report an accident which occurred last night 4<sup>th</sup> March. When proceeding from the camp to the Repair Depot about 9.30 pm. with Co. N.G. 6452 when passing the Entrance to Camp de Courvaux. I felt a knock on the front of my car. I immediately drew up and found a man lying on the road about five yards back. Another soldier was standing on the road when I drew up and on making inquiries said he was unhurt and advised me to take the injured man to No. 10 General Hospital. While waiting at the Hospital a third man was brought in injured whom I had not seen on the road. In my opinion the man must have been lying on the road way as I was keeping a sharp lookout and did not see anybody walking in front of the car. I was travelling at 8 to 10 miles per hour when I applied my brakes.

Two military police were standing within a few yards and were upon the scene at once. There was no damage done to the car.

When passing the entrance to Camp de Courson. I felt a knock on the front of my Car. I immediately drew up and found a man lying on the road about five yards back. Another soldier was standing on the road when I drew up and on making inquiries said he was un hurt and assisted me to take the injured man to No 10 General Hospital. While waiting at the hospital a third man was brought in injured whom I had not seen on the road. In my opinion the man must have been lying on the roadway as I was keeping a sharp look out and did not see anybody walking in front of the car. I was travelling at 8 to 10 miles per hour when I applied my brakes. Two military police were standing within a few yards and were upon the scene at once.  
There was no damage done to the car.



I beg to report for your information that on the 4th. inst. about 2145 hours, I was on duty at No. 2. Post, No. 12 Tram Terminus, Route d'Elbeuf Reuen, accompanied by L/C. Bennisca M.F.P. when I was informed that a motor ambulance No. G6453, driven by Driver W. Glassford, Scottish Mobile Unit, Reuen, had knocked down two Newfoundland soldiers, near the entrance to No. 10 General Hospital, named:-  
 No. 3715. Pte. J. Parke C. Coy. Newfoundland Regt. late No. 2. Com. Depot  
 No. 4868. Pte. A. Bencit " " " " " " " " " " " "

As they appeared to be rather seriously injured, I conveyed them with assistance to No. 10 General Hospital where they were seen by Medical Officer on duty, Lieut. Pogue U.S. Med. Corps who gave the attached Medical Certificate.

The ambulance was proceeding in the direction of Reuen and I am unable to state the speed of the ambulance nor was I able to obtain any reliable witness as to the speed. I did not actually witness the accident myself. The ambulance had two side lights but no head lights. The injured men had just alighted from a tram car at the terminus and my attention was occupied with the tram car at the time. The ambulance was unable to proceed for a time owing to having pulled up so suddenly, but was removed under its own power later. The road was wet and greasy owing to the rain and the night was very dark and under the circumstances, in my opinion no blame can be attached to the driver of the ambulance.
