On sworn evidence I stated that Pte. Parker was on duty for three weeks which was correct. I was questioned on Oath by Crown Prosecutor, McNeilly to explain the Picquet duty, I did so without thinking I was doing any harm as I was on my Oath.

I knew afterward I had done wrong by speaking about Military affairs, and that I am liable to Punishment.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated Oct. 22nd, with reference to inquiry regarding duties that Pte. Parker performed previous to the accident.

I beg to say that this soldier was attached to the Medical Room, his duties being, dressing, and giving medicine, at regular intervals, to men under Doctor's care. In addition he did duty with Picquet up to the 24th. August. Each of these nights he reported at the usual hour (10.30 p.m.) and did not leave Barracks after that.

The duties done up to this date have been checked off in roll books.

I note your remarks. I notice in the newspaper report of this soldier's evidence, that he stated the purpose for which the pickets were on duty, thus communicating military information without authority.

Pickets Duties.

Your remarks with regard to Pte. Parker are very indefinite, please give me a definite statement of the duties of this soldier for the week previous to the accident, having especial regard to night duty.

In the press report of his evidence he refused to divulge where he had slept on the night before the accident, and I take it from this that he did not sleep at the C.L.B. Armoury. Please furnish me with a statement of the number of nights this soldier slept at the Armoury for the two weeks previous to the accident, and what means you have of knowing whether he was in barracks on these.

Sir;-

In answer to your inquiry relating to certain statements made by C.S.M. Gardiner in the course of evidence given in defence in the recent Parker case.

I beg to state that in answer to questions put to the C.S.M. by the Counsel for the Crown as to what he attributed Pte. Parker's dazed condition, he replied, that the accused had not received a proper night's rest for two nights previous to the accident. He further stated that owing to lack of men at Headquarters, Pte. Parker had been on continuous duty for three weeks, and that during that time he had not removed his clothes; he also stated that there was no proper bedding. These statements are absolutely untrue.

Picquet Duties.

It is possible that Pte. Parker was told off for Picquet each night for three weeks, as there ^{were} ~~was~~ insufficient men to make up the required number for the Picquet, which was forty men, and all available men not going Guard duty were warned for this picquet duty. This picquet was told off for special duty and reported at Headquarters at 7 p.m. for instructions. At 7.30 p.m. they were dismissed, having been allowed to take three hours for their own recreation. They reported again at 10.30 p.m. when they were paraded to have the Standing Orders read to them, together with other instructions, which took about twenty minutes, after

which they were dismissed to their sleeping quarters, when each man was told off to go to his bed and divested himself of his clothing and retired for the night, each man being in his bed at 11 o'clock, (lights' out sounded 11.15).

According to Military rules Lights Out should be sounded at 10.15, but this privilege was granted by the Officer Commanding, in consideration of their having to do repeated duty, During this time no man doing Picquet duty lost any sleep.

I slept in the Barracks, and was careful that the Picquet and the Picquet Commanders had retired at the proper hour, and that no unnecessary noise was made to deprive men of their sleep. Reveille sounded at 5.30 a.m., when the Picquet paraded to clean its own quarters and pack their bedding, which usually took about an hour and at 6.30 they were dismissed for Breakfast.

On the 17th. August Pte. Parker was attached to the Medical Room as Orderly, and to my knowledge did not do Picquet duty or any other duty which would deprive him of his sleep; if he was told off for this duty it was unknown to me, but if such was the case this would not deprive him of his rest.

Bedding.

Each man in the Picquet is supplied with a cot bed with canvas bottom, also three woolen blankets and a pillow, and I do not think that there is any other Barracks with beds more comfortable than those supplied to the Regiment at Headquarters.





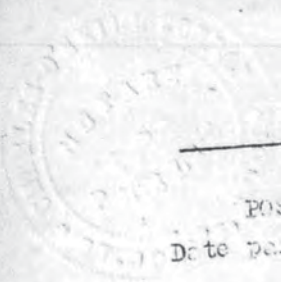
