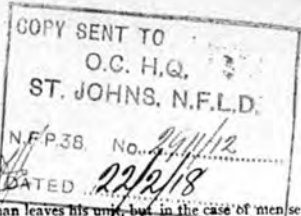

NOTES.—(i.) 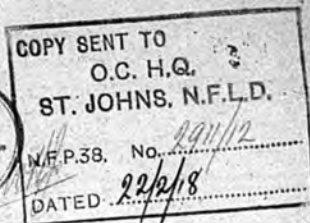

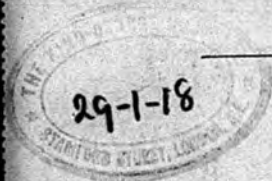

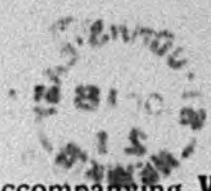
