

Dear Sir:-

Allow me to introduce myself as ex. Private F.C. Payne No. 1006, of the 1st Newfoundland Reg. who enlisted in the month of January 1915. Dear Sir I have been seeking for information since I have been returned as I am very poorly situated since joining the Reg., I had not met with some bad luck my Father was suffering with paralysis for about three years before I enlisted and I had to support both my Mother & my Father which I took great pleasure in doing but owing to small wages at the time found it not easy to do but I managed it and when I enlisted in 1915 there was no separation allowance provided and owing to me having to support my dying Father, and my Mother on one dollar & ten cents per day and out of that had to buy coal rent and support my parents out of so little money while I was in the trenches I had received the sad news of my Father's death which was none too pleasant and after returning I was unable to work for about 12 months in the meantime I was discharged from the Soldiers which made the task rather harder for me to conquer. In reading over the orders shortly after coming home I noticed that there was separation allowances provided for those Soldiers who had any one depending on them as their only support which I want to know if I am entitled to it or noy I am tired of applying for it and not getting any satisfactio I thought I would write Your ---Excellency for some information as I am still up against sometimes I work for a month and then get sick for awhile I had been laid up in bed since I came to Halifax lost the use of my legs Doctor Miller was the Doctor who cured me and who was tending or treating me for my ailment but Thank God I am alright again now I still have my Mother & my wife to support

My Mother is residing at 13 Balsam St., St. John's N.F.L.D.
As my health is not keeping up to what I would like it to.
