The above mentioned soldier served for four years with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, and was discharged at his own request in the United Kingdom. About five months after his discharge he married; and recently he and his wife returned to this country.

Under ruling of the Minister of Militia repatriation at Newfoundland Government expense for soldiers discharged in the United Kingdom, might be claimed by them if the claim is made within six months of the date of discharge; but no provision has been made for the passage of a soldier's wife when the marriage takes place after discharge.

The cost of the passage was £18. 4/-. I have the honour to request whether authority may be issued for refund to Private Peddle of this amount. I may say that the Government has given authority for cost of passage to this country of fiancées of soldiers still serving to be paid from Government funds.

For I was not given another until I went in the line again, I had to salvage one so I hope you will kindly look into the matter for that is too much money for a chap to lose when he does not deserve it.

Dear Col. Rendell:-

Reference to your letter of the 15th. inst., and our conversation of a few days previous, in connection with stoppages against 705. Pte. J. Peddle for loss of rifle and equipment, the following are the facts as far as I can remember:-

After our relief during a tour of the line in October or November 1916, Peddle reported to me that he was unwell and unable to keep pace with the Company. I advised him to keep up, if possible, until we reached the main road, but as he said he was unable to do so, I told him to find his way along in his own time and try to secure a lift from some passing vehicle on the road.

After we had left, Peddle reported to an advanced dressing station where he was thought sufficiently bad to send to a C.C.S., and was kept at the latter place for four or five days, after which he rejoined his unit, minus Kit.

I know for a certainty that it was the rule at the C.C.S. to collect kit from all casualties and return to

Ordinance, which I presume is what happened in Peddle's case, evidently overlooking the fact that he was returning to his Unit and not being evacuated.

In my opinion, the loss of rifle and equipment occurred through some irregularity on the part of the authorities at the C. C. S., and not in any way due to negligence on the part of Pte. Peddle.
