Dear Col. Rendell:-

Reference to your letter of the 15th. inst., and our conversation of a few days previous, in connection with stoppages against 705. Pte. J. Peddle for loss of raffe and equipment, the following are the facts as far as I can remember:-

After our relief during a tour of the line in October or November 1916, Peddle reported to me that he was unwell and unable to keep pace with the Company. I advised him to keep up, if possible, until we reached the main road, but as he said he was unable to do so, I told him to find his way along in his own time and try to secure a lift from some passing vehicle on the road.

After we had left, Peddle reported to an advanced dressing station where he was thought sufficiently bad to send to a C.C.S., and was kept at the latter place for four or five days, after which he rejoined his unit, minus Kit.

I know for a certainty that it was the rule at the C.C.S. to collect kit from all casualities and return to

Ordnance, which I presume is what happened in Peddle's case, evidently overlooking the fact that he was returning to his Unit and not being evacuated.

In my opinion, the loss of rifle and equipment occurred through some irregularity on the part of the authorities at the C.C.S., and not in any way due to negligence on the part of Pte. Peddle.


