Whilst visiting Winchester at the
week-end, I also asked Capt. Knight
about Peel, who corroborated the
report and said that he was quite fit
to continue military training, but he
would keep a special eye on his case.

Under the circumstances, therefore,
I could not get him transferred to
this office, but should his condition

in any way warrant it later on, the matter will again be considered.

Capt. Knight's attachment to the 2nd Bn. has proved a most fortunate and extremely satisfactory one to I think all concerned, certainly to this office, for naturally a man who is attached in a more or less permanent degree is bound to take a keener interest in affairs than one who is there temporarily, and many improvements are apparent.

Capt. Parsons went with me and discussed various matters with Capt. Knight and myself which I think will be to the general benefit of purposes concerned.

Dear Major Timewell,

3888 Lcs.Cpl. Peel.

The above-named soldier left here with the last draft. A day or two ago his father, Thomas Peel of St. Johns, called on me to point out that his son, Lcs. Cpl. Peel, was not by any means of a robust constitution. Whilst he passed the medical test here, still he required continuous attention at home to keep him in ordinary health. His father asked me if I would acquaint the authorities at the Depot of this fact and to say that he desires that his son should be put under observation, and that when he is being medically examined for services at the Front the medical authorities should be acquainted of the foregoing.

Lcs. Cpl. Peel had been doing Orderly Room duty for a considerable time at Headquarters, and his work prior to joining the Regiment was principally office work and travelling insurance agent. Should his medical examination be such that he is not considered sufficiently strong to undertake active service, and as he is most desirous of serving his King and Country, it is desired that should a vacancy occur in your office he might be given an opportunity to serve there.

I would thank you to direct the attention of the Commanding Officer of the 2nd Battalion to this man so that due precaution will be taken to see that he is not put on duty that he may not be able to continue to perform. Personally, I don't know very much about him except that I think he is sincere in his desire to do his duty, and as his father is so anxious that his physical status should be inquired into I thought I would put the matter before you with a view to having it considered by the proper authorities at the Depot.

The above-named soldier left here with the last draft. A day or two ago his father, Thomas Peel of St. John's, called on me to point out that his son, Lce. Cpl. Peel, was not by any means of a robust constitution. Whilst he passed the medical test here, still he required continuous attention at home to keep him in ordinary health. His father asked me if I would acquaint the authorities at the Depot of this fact and to say that he desires that his son should be put under observation, and that when he is being medically examined for services at the Front the medical authorities should be acquainted of the foregoing.

Lce. Cpl. Peel had been doing Orderly Room duty for a considerable time at Headquarters, and his work prior to joining the Regiment was principally office work and travelling insurance agent. Should his medical examination be such that he is not considered sufficiently strong to undertake active service, and as he is most desirous of serving his King and Country, it is desired that should a vacancy occur in your office he might be given an opportunity to serve there.

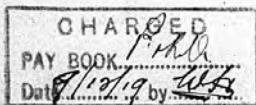


